Colonial attacks


– Attacks on individuals and facilities:

During the period covered by the report in May 2022, the CWRC monitored a total of 6,107 violations. These attacks affected individuals, property, land and natural resources. These attacks were mainly concentrated in the governorates of Bethlehem, Hebron and Ramallah. During the aforementioned period, these attacks included the martyrdom of nine Palestinian in the governorates of Jenin, Ramallah, Nablus and Bethlehem. These attacks took different forms, where the colonizers carried out 133 attacks, while the number of attacks on property and land reached 186, in which 42 cases of demolition occurred, including the demolition of the only mosque in Arab al-Ramadin community, south of Qalqilya, and 73 cases of vandalism and destruction of property belonging to the Palestinian citizens. 24 cases of property confiscation, most of which are classified as agricultural properties, including barracks, tents and tractors.



– Colonizers' attacks:

The colonizers' gangs, according to what was monitored by the CWRC, carried out 133 attacks that took the nature of organized crime against Palestinian citizens and their property, perhaps one of the most brutal acts of the colonizers is spraying pepper gas on the two-month-old of Mr. Muhammad Fashafsha from the village of Jaba, in front of the Israeli soldiers at the checkpoint, who did nothing. These attacks focused on Nablus governorate, which is surrounded by the colonies of "Elon Moreh, Itamar, Yitzhar, and Shavei Shomron", which are considered the most extreme and fierce, and home of the terrorist groups of "hilltop youth" and "price tag".



– Attacks on property & land

The crews of the CWRC managed, during the month of May, to record 202 cases of attacks that affected the lands and properties of Palestinian citizens. These attacks included the bulldozing of approximately 155 dunams of land. These attacks focused on Hebron governorate with 29 attacks, followed by Nablus with 26 attacks, then Jerusalem and Bethlehem with 25 attacks.



- Demolitions:

The number of demolitions carried out by the Israeli occupation forces during the month of May reached 42 cases of demolition of homes, commercial facilities, livelihoods, facilities and religious places, with a total of 69 facilities. These operations were concentrated in Jerusalem governorate with the demolition of 27 facilities, Hebron with 10 facilities, and Jericho & Bethlehem with 9 facilities each.



- Attacks on Trees:

The CWRC monitored, during the period targeted by the report, a total of 577 trees were cut down and uprooted by the colonizers militias, including 537 olive trees. Most of these attacks were concentrated in Bethlehem governorates with 300 uprooted trees, and Nablus governorate with 200 trees.



Colonial expntion

Attacks on individuals and facilities:

– Approval of new plans for colonies:

On Thursday, 12/5/2022, the colonial "Supreme Council for Planning" approved the building of 4427 colonial units in the occupied West Bank. According to the available documents and plans, the council approved the construction of 3,988 units, including 2,536 for final approval, within 25 building plans in many colonies built on Palestinian lands in the West Bank.

Announcing a new local colonial council:

On May 9, 2022, the military commander of the central region in the Israeli occupation forces signed an order to unite the colonies of "Etz Ephraim" and "Shaarei Tikva," which were established on the lands of citizens in Qalqilya Governorate, within one colonial local council under the name "Sha'ar Hashimron." Which would contribute to expanding the viability of these colonies, providing them with services and allocating higher budgets than the Supreme Council of Colonies, in order to ensure their further expansion on citizens' lands. Note that the last local council declared in the West Bank was the council of the colony of Beit El, 24 years ago

Establishment of new colonial outposts:


- On May 18, 2022, colonizers established a new colonial outpost on the lands of the town of Bani Naim in Hebron Governorate, and on May 25, 2022, a colonial outpost was established to the south of the outpost that was established in the area.
- At the beginning of May, which is covered by this report, colonizers established a new colonial outpost west of "Ahia" outpost on the southern lands of the town of Jalud in Nablus governorate, the colonizers began to equip the area with infrastructure and set up 7 mobile homes. This was preceded by bulldozing in the vicinity of the outpost on lands belonging to the palestinian town's residents.
- The extremist colonial "Nahla" movement, which oversaw the construction of the informal outpost "Eviatar" that was established on citizens' lands in the village of Beita in Nablus governorate, initiated a large meeting at the headquarters of the Regional Council of colonies in Ramallah area and north of occupied Jerusalem, in which about 400 activists in the colonies participated in it, during which the "Ten Eviatar" plan, meaning ten new outposts, was announced simultaneously on July 20.

Legitimizing new outposts:

In order to avoid declaring the establishment of new colonies, these outposts were approved as "neighborhoods" of the existing colonies: Mitzpe Dani – as part of Ma'aleh Makhmach, Oz Haavigon as part of Migdal Oz; And Mitzpe Lachish – as part of Negohot. The Supreme Council for Planning approved the construction of 180 hotel rooms in the outpost of Oz Haavigon, adjacent to the lands of citizens in Bethlehem, and approved the construction of 158 new housing units in the outpost of Mitzpe Dani near Jerusalem, in addition to approving a plan allocated to Mitzpe Lachish with an area of 520 dunams, through which the Israeli government will connect the colonial outpost to the existing colony of Nahijot and considering it one of its neighborhoods, as an alternative to establishing new colonies, in addition to building 158 new units in it, as it will create a huge colonial block in the area, extending over an area of about 81 dunums.

Forced displacement in Masafer Yatta

The occupation forces demolished eight Palestinian houses, sheep pens and agricultural barracks in Masafer Yatta area, south of Hebron. The demolitions took place in the villages of Al-Tawana, Al Markaz and Al-Fakhit. Before that, the so-called Israeli "Supreme Court" in occupied Jerusalem rejected a petition



submitted by the residents of 12 residential communities in the villages of Masafer Yatta, against the occupation's decision to declare these areas as "Fire shooting" zones which means their demolition and the displacement of nearly 2,000 Palestinians, and the declaration of more than 30,000 dunums of its lands as "Fire shooting" zones that prevent Palestinians from entering it. The data indicate that the occupation authorities have issued since the year 199 a total of 358 demolition notices, in order to evict the residents under the false pretext of "residing illegally in a firing zone."

Light Rail

The so-called Israeli Supreme Court gave the green light on May 15, 2022 to start implementing the "Light Rail" project in the city of Jerusalem, which implies for the confiscation of 82.5 dunums of lands of villages north of occupied East Jerusalem in order to build infrastructure for the extension of the light rail linking West Jerusalem with the city's airport, and in the industrial area of Qalandyia (Atarot), and the extension of the infrastructure to the largest colonial bloc north of the occupied city, despite the objections presented against it. The implementation of this plan requires the installation of huge columns in the center of archaeological sites; What will affect the features of the Old City of Jerusalem, and the view of its walls. Also, the construction and operation of the cable car involves harming dozens of Palestinian families in Silwan.

The "Light Rail" project is part of the "structural project in the vicinity of Old Jerusalem", which the Israeli occupation authorities began working on before more than ten years, and two years ago, the "Jerusalem Development Authority" launched and announced the cable car project in the vicinity of the Old City in partnership with the municipality of Jerusalem and the Ministries of Transportation and Tourism, as the Israeli occupation authorities consider this project to be among the "national projects for transportation and transporting tourists to the Old City."
