Foreword:

What our Palestinian people are experiencing in various regions of our homeland is no longer just a series of isolated attacks or fleeting incidents. It has evolved into a systematic policy implemented by the occupying state, through its military and settlers, to impose new colonial realities on the ground and fragment Palestinian land. The Commission's report for August 2025 documented an unprecedented scale of violations, providing clear evidence that the occupation is steadily moving toward establishing a comprehensive apartheid system that targets land, people, and resources alike.

This month, the CWRC has documented 1,613 attacks by the Israeli occupying army and colonizers against Palestinian villages, cities, and Bedouin communities, tragically resulting in the martyrdom of two innocent citizens. Additionally, large areas of land were bulldozed and confiscated, and thousands of trees, which are essential to the livelihoods of countless Palestinian families, were uprooted. There has also been an increase in attempts to establish new colonial outposts, part of a political plan aimed at converting these outposts into “legal colonies” that would suffocate Palestinian existence and hinder natural development.

We, in the CWRC, affirm that these violations, across all dimensions, not only represent daily crimes against our people but also pose a direct challenge to international will and United Nations resolutions. Therefore, exposing and documenting these practices is a fundamental step in our ongoing struggle for freedom, dignity, and justice.



First: Violations of the Israeli Occupation State & Colonizers in the Occupied Palestinian Territories in August 2025:

During the reporting period, August 2025, the Colonization & Wall Resistance Commission (CWRC) monitored 1631 attacks. These attacks were carried out by the various bodies of the Israeli occupying state, including its colonial militia, against Palestinian citizens and their properties.

Of these, 1182 attacks were carried out by the Israeli army, while the colonizers perpetrated 431 attacks.

These attacks included assaults and physical injuries, caused by live ammunition, gas, or terrorism. They also involved raids, vandalism, theft, property confiscation, land




bulldozing, uprooting trees, and imposing closures and barriers that undermine the unity of Palestinian geography.

However, the majority of these attacks occurred in the governorate of Ramallah which witnessed 321 attacks. This was followed by Nablus Governorate (274 attacks). Meanwhile, 220 attacks were recorded in Hebron governorate. These governorates experienced intensive attacks, amounting to 51% of the total attacks. The other governorates faced a similarly difficult situation. The governorates of Tulkarm, Bethlehem, and Jerusalem experienced over 100 attacks each.

These attacks included 384 attacks on property and holy places, 114 attacks on lands and natural resources, and 1115 attacks on citizens.

A comparison of the total Israeli violations during the past three months:




Attacks Perpetrated by the Israeli Occupation State & Colonizers against Palestinian Citizens, their Properties and Holy Places.

Attacks on citizens:

During the reporting period, August 2025, the Colonization & Wall Resistance Commission (CWRC)

documented 1115 attacks on citizens. Most of these attacks were concentrated in Ramallah & al Bireh Governorate which witnessed 225 attacks, followed by Nablus Governorate which witnessed 180 attacks.




Meanwhile, 145 attacks were recorded in Hebron governorate. These attacks included shooting, arrest campaigns, shutting down checkpoints, intimidation, and imposing traffic restrictions on citizens

Attacks on Lands & Natural Resources:

In August 2025, the Colonization & Wall Resistance Commission (CWRC) has documented 114 attacks on the Palestinian lands and natural resources¹. These attacks were concentrated in the governorates of Ramallah & al-Bireh which was subjected to 33 attacks, followed by Nablus and Hebron governorates where 26 attacks were recorded in each of them. These attacks affected hundreds of dunums of citizens’



lands. During the reporting period, August 2025, there were 19 attempts by colonizers to establish colonial outposts in the governorates of Nablus, Salfit, Qalqilia, Ramallah & al Bireh, Jenin, Bethlehem, Jericho and Hebron. Additionally,

the Israeli occupation authorities and colonizers carried out 27 bulldozing lands' operations. These operations were concentrated in Ramallah & al Bireh Governorate, where 8 bulldozing lands' operations took place, followed by Nablus governorate which was subjected to 7 bulldozing lands' operations. Meanwhile, 7 bulldozing lands' operations were recorded in Hebron governorate and 6 operations were carried out in Nablus.

Attacks on Trees:

During the reporting period, August 2025, the Colonization & Wall Resistance Commission (CWRC) documented 68 attacks on trees that caused the uprooting, poisoning and burning of 11700 trees among which there were 11599 olive trees. These attacks were concentrated in Ramallah & al Bireh governorate where 19 attacks were recorded, followed by the governorates of Nablus and Hebron which witnessed 16 attacks for each.

Attacks on Palestinians' Properties:

In August 2025, the CWRC documented 384 Israeli attacks on Palestinian property. During this period, the occupying army and colonial militias carried out extensive campaigns to confiscate and steal citizens' property.



The targeted properties included vehicles, camera recordings, bulldozers, solar panels, water tanks, livestock, and money. Furthermore, there were 222 incidents of property vandalism and 48 documented incidents of confiscations and thefts of properties during the reporting period. Specifically, the Israeli forces were involved in the theft of 12 vehicles, one bulldozer, 7 instances of money confiscation, 2 instances of confiscating printing presses, agricultural equipment, one generator, one residential tent, one water tank, as well as the confiscation of schoolbooks. In addition, the colonizers were responsible for the theft of various items, including 335 livestock (sheep, cows, and a camel), one tractor, the confiscation of solar panels, two generators, one water pump, one vehicle, 7 cases of stealing agricultural equipment, two residential tents, 2 cases of stealing home contents, one mobile phone, stealing olive trees, and one residential barracks.




Colonizers' Attacks: According to what was monitored and documented by the Colonization and Wall Resistance Commission (CWRC) during the reporting period, August 2025, the colonizers carried out 431 organized attacks. These attacks varied between the occupation army's protection of the colonists in their storming of Palestinian cities and communities, breaking into Palestinian villages, confiscating citizens' property, drawing racist slogans on the walls, and bulldozing lands, as what happened in the villages of Qabalan, Deir Ballut, Dahr al-Abd, Khirbet Masoud, Asira al-Qibliya, Umm al-Khair, Birin, Aqwawis, Deir Razakh, al-Rihyah, Deir Jarir, Umm Safa, Deir Dibwan, Turmusa'ya, al-Mughayyir and other areas.

The most prominent of these colonial attacks was storming the holy places; among which was the squares of Al-Aqsa Mosque in the occupied city of Jerusalem. During the reporting period, August 2025, 7320 Israeli colonizers, protected by the Israeli occupation army, carried out 29 raids into Al-Aqsa Mosque Squares. Besides, 1678 colonizers carried out provocative tours under what is called “tourism to the squares of Al-Aqsa Mosque”. Furthermore, the situation at the Ibrahimi Mosque in Hebron sharply deteriorated as occupation authorities implemented restrictions on prayer access and prevented the call to prayer. The Israeli actions taken against al-Ibrahimi Mosque represent a blatant and unprecedented attack, provoking the feelings of Muslims and showing a disregard for the sanctity of religious rituals.

Notably worth, most of these attacks were concentrated in Ramallah & al Bireh Governorate which was subjected to 115 attacks, followed by Nablus governorate where 77 attacks



were recorded. Meanwhile, 69 attacks were documented in Hebron governorate.



Examples on colonizers' attacks carried out in August 2025:

On August 2, 2025, the citizen “Moein Sobhi Diriya” martyred of critical wounds sustained by a colonizer’s bullets during an attack carried out by colonial militias from the so-called “Mount Qarqafah” outpost, south of the town of Aqraba, in the Mahfouriya plain area south of Nablus. A group of colonizers attacked the area, and residents confronted them. One of the colonizers opened fire, wounding five young men with moderate to minor injuries. Moein Sobhi Diriya was later declared dead.



On August 10, 2025: a group of colonizers fenced off new lands near Palestinian tents in al-Farisiya in the northern Jordan Valley. They placed new iron signs and established barbed wire near Palestinian tents in the al-Farisiya Ghazal Spring in the northern Jordan Valley. It's worth noting that the area has been

witnessing the fencing of agricultural lands in stages for months, near Palestinian tents, leading to the closure of hundreds of dunams to farmers.

On August 10, 2025, a group of colonizers set fire to a facility belongs to the citizen “Abdul Aziz Shaqeer” from the town of Al-Zawiya, west of Salfit, and forcibly expelled him from his land. Shaqeer explained that a group of



colonizers stormed “Khallet Hamad” area west of the town and set fire to the agricultural barn, including its agricultural equipment and tools. They also burned eight ancient olive trees and vandalized a rainwater well, causing significant material

losses. He pointed out that the colonizers assaulted him and his family, forcibly expelling them from the land they had lived on for decades and relied on for raising livestock. He explained that these attacks are carried out frequently, with this being the second incident of its kind this year.



On August 13, 2025, the Ministry of Health declared that the young man, “Thamin Khalil Reda Dawabsheh” (35 years old), matryed of his wounds from colonizers' bullets in the town of Duma, south of Nablus. In addition, the head of the Duma Village Council, Suleiman Dawabsheh, confirmed that the colonizers attacked the citizens and opened fire at them in the

southern area of the village, amid land-bulldozing operations that the area has been witnessing for days.

On August 11, 2025, a group of colonizers established a new colonial outpost on lands of Atara, northwest of Ramallah. Dozens of colonizers , accompanied by a bulldozer, stormed "Jabal al-Khirba" area at the entrance to the town. They began paving a dirt road for the area and erecting tents there.

On August 12, 2025, a group of colonizers re-established the last mentioned colonial outpost on lands in the town of Atara, after being demolished by the Israeli force in the last say. That is, more than 15 colonizers set up two tents, brought cows and sheep,



and released them into the lands surrounding the outpost.

On August 14, 2025, a group of colonizers re-established the colonial outpost after it was demolished by the Israeli occupation army four



times previously. It was reported that the colonizers re-erected colonial tents on the lands of the "Khirbet Tarfin" mountain, near the entrance to the town of Atara.

On August 15, 2025, a group of colonizers set fire to four vehicles and parts of a house in the town of Atara, northwest of Ramallah. They threw Molotov cocktails at the house, causing material damage, and drew racist slogans on the walls, while fire engines rushed to extinguish the fire. **On August 20, 2025**, a group of colonizers damaged olive trees and stole agricultural equipment in Atara. They attempted to assault the owners of the land, the brothers, “Mahmoud and Muhammad Abdullah Hammad”, preventing them from accessing it, and destroyed the surveillance cameras and lighting. The brothers explained



that the colonizers deliberately released their livestock onto the 6-dunam land, the thing which led to the destruction of crops and trees. It's worth noting that the land is adjacent to the colonial outpost established by colonizers about a week ago, where they re-erected tents on the lands of "Khirbet Tarfin" mountain, near the entrance to the town of Atara. A week earlier, the colonizers had established the outpost for the first time in an attempt to seize the mountain, which is estimated to be approximately 2,000 dunams in area and is considered an archaeological site.



It is noteworthy that “Jabal al-Khirba” area, which is about 2,000 dunams, is an archaeological site and is frequently subjected to colonizers’ attacks, as part of a colonial settlement policy aimed at

displacing the Palestinian population and threatening security and stability. **On August 25, 2025**, the colonizers set up a new tent inside the new colonial outpost on the citizens' lands of Atara. They set up a ninth tent in the place and installed new water tanks and an electricity transformer to light the outpost, to seize it for colonial

expansion purposes. It was reported that a colonizer and his sheep stormed a grape vineyard belonging to citizen “Adham Lafi” in the town, after breaking its lock and gate. **On August 11, 2025**, several colonizers had established a colonial outpost on an area estimated at 25 dunams, and paved dirt roads.

On August 18, 2025, the colonizers’ bulldozers began paving a new colonial road in the eastern part of the village of Um Safa, northwest of Ramallah. It was reported that paving the road completely isolated the home of “Mohammed Al-Abayat” from the village. It is noteworthy that the colonizers attacked Al-Abayat's home two days ago and attempted to assault him, causing material damage, before the citizens confronted them and forced them to withdraw to the new outpost established on “Jabal al-Ras”.

On August 25, 2025, Colonizers installed dozens of caravans in the village of Birin, east of Hebron. Under the protection of the occupation forces, colonizers transported and installed these caravans in three new colonial outposts (Adorim, Beni Hefer, and Mits’ereze). These outposts confiscated around 6400 dunums of land from the town of Bani Na’im and the city of Hebron. This all comes as a result of the colonial plan announced by the Israeli occupation government for this area, following the incursions by extremist ministers, Smotrich and Ben-Gvir. The colonizers assaulted a number of citizens in the area and installed a large menorah. The area also has been subjected to a major colonizers’ assault two months prior, where a colonial road was constructed and vast areas of land were confiscated and wells and crops were destroyed.

On August 26, 2025, A number of Palestinian citizens and foreign solidarity activists were injured in an attack orchestrated by colonizers on Masafir Yatta, south of Hebron. The Palestinian Red Crescent Society reported that its crews treated 4




injured individuals, 3 of whom were foreign solidarity activists and a young man due to an assault in Masafir Yatta. They were transferred to the hospital. The colonizers attacked both the citizens and the foreign allies in the Khirbet Iqwaweess, east of Yatta and caused injuries to a

number of them. It was mentioned that the colonizers have escalated their attacks against citizens and their properties with the protection of the occupation army in Masafir Yatta in an attempt to forcibly displace them from their places of residence.

Second: Procedures and Practices of the Occupation Authorities against Palestinian Facilities

A. Demolitions

According to the violations database of the Colonization & Wall Resistance Commission, during the period covered by the report of August 2025, the occupation authorities carried out a




total of 57 demolition operations, affecting 125 facilities across the West Bank, including Jerusalem. The majority of demolitions were concentrated in Jerusalem Governorate, where 12 demolitions destroyed 44 facilities. This was followed by the Bethlehem Governorate, with 11 demolitions leading to 16 demolished facilities.

However, when considering demolition orders (refer to the demolition notifications section), a strong correlation between issued notices and actual demolitions becomes evident, particularly in the southern West Bank. This region contains vast areas targeted by the occupation for displacement and depopulation in favor of colonial expansion. The demolitions during the period covered by the report affected various types of facilities, including inhabited residential homes, uninhabited and under-construction homes, agricultural facilities, mobile homes (caravans), commercial and industrial barracks, and water wells as is demonstrated by the following table.



B. Notifications (Demolition, Construction Moratorium, and Evacuation)

During the period covered by the report, August 2025, Israeli occupation authorities issued 21 notifications, ranging from demolition or construction moratorium orders due to lack of permits to eviction notifications under the pretext of military training. The majority of



these notifications were concentrated in the Jerusalem Governorate, with 10 notifications, followed by the Bethlehem Governorate with 5 notifications, and then Qalqilya and Nablus governorates with 2 notifications each.

The demolition notifications issued by the Israeli occupation authorities in the West Bank serve as one of the means it utilizes to restrict Palestinians in Area “C” and obstruct their development and urban expansion. In light of the occupation’s control of planning in these areas, they deny Palestinians their right to prepare master plans. Even when these master plans were submitted, they were rejected, preventing Palestinians from utilizing Area “C”, which constitutes 61% of the West Bank. This area is being kept for the expansion of colonies and as a strategic reserve for future use.

Second: Land Expropriation (Land Confiscation)


In August of this year, the occupation authorities seized a total of 45 dunums of citizens' land through 4 seizure orders for military purposes. These orders aimed to establish a buffer zone around the Eli Zahav colony on lands of Deir Ballut in Salfit Governorate. Two additional orders targeted the village of Deir Istiya in the same governorate for the purpose of constructing colonial roads, while the final order targeted lands of the town of Tammun in Tubas Governorate to establish a military outpost in the area.

First Order: The occupation forces seized an area of 8.298 dunums from the lands of the town of Tammun in Tubas Governorate under the pretext of a seizure order for Military and Security purposes. Order No. T/141/25 aims to establish an outpost for the occupation army.




Second Order:

The occupation forces seized an area of 4.727 dunums from the lands of Deir Istiya in Salfit Governorate under the pretext of a seizure order for Military and Security purposes. Order No. T/139/25 aims to construct a colonial road connecting the Emmanuel colony with another colonial road.



Third Order: The occupation forces seized an area of 11.562 dunums from the lands of Deir Istiya in Salfit Governorate under the pretext of a seizure order for Military and Security purposes. Order No. T/132/25 aims to construct a colonial road connecting the Yakir and Karne Shomron colonies, both established on lands within Salfit Governorate. For this purpose, the occupying state allocated a total of 2.156 dunums of land declared as "state land" in favor of the military order, which corresponds to the area marked in blue on the order's map.



Fourth Order: The occupation forces seized an area of 20.312 dunums from the lands of the towns of Deir Ballut and Kafr ad-Dik in Governorate under the pretext of a seizure order for Military and Security purposes. Order No. T/128/25 aims to establish a buffer zone surrounding the Eli Zahav colony, which is built on confiscated Palestinian land in the area. The spatial scope of the declared area includes: A portion designated as "state land," a portion previously seized since 1982, and a new area incorporated under this order.



Third: Colonial Expansion Plans (Deposited and Approved)

Last August, the planning authorities in the occupation state studied 31 master plans in favor of the West Bank colonies and within the municipal boundaries of the occupation municipality in occupied Jerusalem. 27 master plans were studied of the West Bank colonies while 4 were studied for occupied Jerusalem colonies within municipal boundaries.

The planning authorities in the occupation state approved 15 master plans for West Bank colonies and deposited 12 others, approving the construction of 4492 new colonial units and depositing 2328 others on an area of 2594 dunums.

The occupation municipality in occupied Jerusalem approved one master plan and deposited 3 others in favor of occupied Jerusalem colonies within municipal boundaries. 245 colonial units were deposited while no new colonial units were approved. This plan targeted 9.443 dunums of citizens' lands.

First: Master Plans in the West Bank

The maps attached to the master plans expose the occupation's plans to transform a group of colonial outposts around the Eli colony, established on citizens' lands in the Qaryout, As-Sawiyeh, and Al-Libban villages in the Nablus Governorate, into big colonial neighborhoods affiliated to the colony. In the previous period the occupation state approved of a group of huge master plans that aim to create huge expansions to the colony of Eli in order to continue the plans to separate the middle part of the West Bank completely from its northern part through the colonial bloc that extends between the colonies of Shilo and Eli and the colonial outposts surrounding them in the area between the governorates of Ramallah and Nablus.

In August, the occupation state approved two major plans. The first one carried the number 237 / 5 / 71 on an area estimated at 638 dunums to build 650 colonial units to

legalize a large colonial outpost east of Eli. They also approved of plan number /ישׁ 237 /6, which aims to build a total of 347 new colonial units on an area of 383 dunums. This plan is intended to legalize the “Hayovel Harim” colonial outpost and convert it into a colonial neighborhood affiliated with the colony. This neighborhood will have all the privileges allocated by the occupation government to the colonial project that devours Palestinian land.

Upon reviewing the maps of the plans and their attached documents, it was revealed that the occupation authorities have approved the construction of a new colony on Ramallah Governorate lands, specifically on the territories of the villages of Al-Midya and Ni'lin. This is being implemented through the announced expansion of the Ganei Modi'in (Hashmona'im) colony under plans numbered 208 /3 /1 / ישׁ and 208 /3 /3 / ישׁ. The first plan aims to build 150 new colonial units on an area estimated at 141 dunums, while the second plan aims to build 194 units targeting lands geographically far beyond the boundaries of the existing colony. This constitutes a clear manipulation by the occupying state to avoid declaring the establishment of a new colony by falsely claiming mere expansion operations.

Second: Master Plans and Colonial Bids of Colonial Units in Occupied Jerusalem


The planning authorities of the occupation state, represented by the District Committee of the Jerusalem Municipality, reviewed a total of 4 master plans aimed at colonial expansion in the colonies established in Jerusalem. They approved 1 plan and deposited 3 others, amounting to 245 colonial units that were deposited, with no new colonial units approved. This took place on an area estimated at 9.443 dunums of citizens' land.

Third: The E1 Colonial Plan

On August 20 of this year, the Israeli occupation authorities approved a colonial construction plan in the (E1)² area, east of occupied Jerusalem. The plan includes the construction of over 3401 housing units³, in



addition to the establishment of a new colony named "Ashahel," which will include 342 colonial units and public buildings.

The occupation government had initially approved the concept of the colonial "E1" plan, carrying the number (4/420) in 1999. This plan spans lands covering 12000 dunums, most of which were declared "state lands" and later became part of the "Ma'ale Adumim" colony. In 2012, the occupation government ratified the colonial "E1" plan, which includes the following plans:

- Plan number (2/4/420), through which the occupation seizes (1350) dunums to establish an industrial zone northwest of the E1 area.

- Plan number (9/4/420), through which the occupation seizes (180) dunums to establish a headquarters for the occupation police. The aforementioned headquarters has been constructed to expand areas of seizure.
- A plan to seize an area of (500) dunums from the lands of Anata and Shu'fat to establish a waste dump, which is later intended to be converted into a public park for colonizers.
- Three detailed construction plans: Plan (10/4/420) to build 2176 colonial units, Plan (3/4/420) to build 256 colonial units in addition to 2152 hotel rooms, and Plan (7/10/420) to build 1250 colonial units, along with another plan to establish a biblical park to the northwest of the aforementioned project.

In addition to the above, there is another colonial plan to implement the so-called "Lifescape Road." Part of this road has already been completed near the racist Annexation and Expansion Wall east of Anata, reaching al-Za'im. The other part is proposed to be constructed from al-Za'im to al-Eizariya. This road aims to serve the implementation and development of the construction project mentioned above, in addition to being a future proposal to convert the Jerusalem-al-Eizariya road and prevent Palestinian citizens from using it.

Fourth: Attitudes and Racist Statements by Prominent Characters in the Israeli Occupation State

These days, leaders of the Israeli occupation have started making their racist statements unabashedly, revealing their superiority complexes and racist stances. In this section of the report, we quickly review the most prominent statements.

- **On August 10, 2025:** Ben-Gvir stated: “I will implore Prime Minister to take immediate operational steps to dismantle the Palestinian Authority to the next Cabinet meeting...crushing the terrorist authority that Abu Mazen heads”⁴.
- **On August 10, 2025:** Israel Katz stated: “The refugee camps in northern Samaria - Jenin, Tulkarm and Nur a-Shams - were terrorist hotbeds”⁵.
- **On August 14, 2025:** Smotrich stated: “They will talk about a Palestinian dream - and we will continue to build a Jewish reality. This reality finally buries the idea of the Palestinian State. Those who attempt to recognize a Palestinian State will receive our response on the ground”⁶.
- On August 14, 2025, Dan Illouz stated: "The approval of construction in the E1 area is another nail in the coffin of our enemies' dream of establishing a Palestinian state... The entire Land of Israel belongs solely to the people of Israel"⁷.
- On August 16, 2025, Itamar Ben-Gvir stated: "In the Middle East, results are achieved only through deterrence"⁸.

- On August 18, 2025, Simcha Rothman stated: "The establishment of a Palestinian state is the first step toward the destruction of Israel. We must apply sovereignty over Judea and Samaria"⁹.
- On August 21, 2025, Dan Illouz stated: "We will build in E1, and we will continue building... Europe is on the verge of collapse, and its Western culture is occupied by radical Islam"¹⁰.
- On August 22, 2025, Israel Gantz (Head of the Mateh Binyamin Regional Council) stated: "IDF forces are operating in the village of the murderers—the village of al-Mughayyir"¹¹.
- On August 22, 2025, Israel Katz stated: "If they in Gaza do not agree to our terms, we will turn Gaza City into Beit Hanoun and Rafah (meaning destruction). We have also approved plans for the military to decide on opening fire against Hamas and evacuating the population"¹².
- On August 25, 2025, Limor Son Har Melech (Deputy Knesset Speaker) stated: "I am proud to lead the flag of sovereignty and settlement... I pledge to continue the struggle until sovereignty is applied across all areas of our land"¹³.
- On August 26, 2025, Eli Cohen (Energy Minister) stated: "We continue to strengthen settlements in Judea and Samaria, the borders of our ancestors"¹⁴.

- On August 27, 2025, Yair Chetboun (Mayor of Ariel) stated: "I call on the political cabinet members to accept the decision and approve Jewish settlement in Judea and Samaria"¹⁵.
- On August 27, 2025, Osher Shekliem (Knesset Member) stated: "At the celebration of the establishment of 17 new settlements... we will continue to strengthen settlement and apply sovereignty"¹⁶.
- On August 28, 2025, Smotrich stated: "Israel will embark on a rapid military and political move... The political decision: gradual annexation of territories in the Gaza Strip and implementation of the Trump plan for voluntary emigration"¹⁷.
- On August 28, 2025, Dan Illouz stated: "Full sovereignty must be exercised over Judea and Samaria and the Jordan Valley... The time is now"¹⁸.
- On August 31, 2025, Amichai Shekli (Diaspora Affairs Minister) stated: "Sovereignty over the entire area—no talk of blocs... Declaration of full sovereignty across all area C"¹⁹.
- On August 31, 2025, Yossi Dagan stated: "The concept of sovereignty in blocs means establishing a terrorist state in most of the territories of Judea and Samaria"²⁰.
