**Foreword:**

The brutal colonial attacks resulted in the martyrdom of four citizens in Silwad and Al-Mazra'a Al-Sharqiya in Ramallah Governorate, as well as in the village of Umm Al-Khair, located south of Hebron. These attacks also led to the forced displacement of two Bedouin communities in Jericho and Bethlehem, specifically “Arab Al-Malihah” and “Deir Alla” communities, affecting 50 Palestinian families, consisting 267 citizens. This ongoing tragedy is part of a broader strategy to create a coercive and hostile environment, systematically supported by official institutions of the Israeli occupying state. Since October 7, 2023, the number of Bedouin communities displaced due to colonizers' terrorism has reached 33.

The crimes of the colonizers have reached unprecedented levels, exceeding in their nature the idea of primitive violence, to a kind of organized terrorism sponsored by the official institution. These crimes include setting fires, field executions, and the deportation of citizens. The Israeli occupying state not only protects these brutal attacks against Palestinians but also provides the colonizers with support, care, and immunity.


Amid the horrific events that the Palestinian territories witness these days, there are despicable coalition promises made by the prime minister of the occupation government to religious Zionist ministers to prevent them from bringing down the government. This once again points to a terrorist occupation mentality that considers the assault on Palestinians, their geography, way of life, and their blood as political material for cheap political calculations. This logic, of course, did not begin here and at this time. Rather, it began from the very beginning of the occupation, which has escalated over seven decades and has reached one of its most dangerous stages these days.

## Violations of the Israeli Occupation State & Colonizers in the Occupied Palestinian Territories in July 2025:

During the reporting period, July 2025, the Colonization & Wall Resistance Commission (CWRC) monitored 1821 attacks. These attacks were carried out by the various bodies of the Israeli occupying state, including its colonial militia, against Palestinian citizens and their properties. Of these, 1355 attacks were carried out by the Israeli army, while the colonizers perpetrated 466 attacks.

These attacks included assaults and physical injuries, caused by live ammunition, gas, or terrorism. They also involved raids, vandalism, theft, property




confiscation, land bulldozing, uprooting trees, and imposing closures and barriers that undermine the unity of Palestinian geography. However, the majority of these attacks occurred in the governorate of Ramallah which witnessed 302 attacks. This was followed by Hebron Governorate (300 attacks). Meanwhile, 293 attacks were recorded in Nablus governorate and 230 attacks in Bethlehem.

These governorates experienced intensive attacks, amounting to 62% of the total attacks. The other governorates faced a similarly difficult situation. The governorates of Tulkarm, Jenin, and Jerusalem experienced over one hundred attacks for each.

These attacks included 473 attacks on property and holy places, 127 attacks on lands and natural resources, and 1221 attacks on citizens.


A comparison of the total Israeli violations during the past three months:



### **Attacks Perpetrated by the Israeli Occupation State & Colonizers against Palestinian Citizens, their Properties and Holy Places.**

#### **Attacks on citizens:**

During the reporting period, July 2025, the Colonization & Wall Resistance Commission (CWRC) documented 1221 attacks on citizens. Most of these attacks were concentrated in Hebron Governorate which witnessed 199 attacks, followed by Nablus Governorate which witnessed 193 attacks. Meanwhile, 192 attacks were recorded in Ramallah & al-Bireh governorate and 161 attacks in Bethlehem governorate. Meanwhile, 154 attacks were recorded in Hebron governorate. These attacks included




shooting, arrest campaigns, shutting down checkpoints, intimidation, and imposing traffic restrictions on citizens.

**Attacks on Lands & Natural Resources:**

In July 2025, the Colonization & Wall Resistance Commission (CWRC) has documented 127 attacks on the Palestinian lands and natural resources<sup>1</sup>. These attacks were concentrated in the governorates of Hebron which was subjected to 33 attacks, followed by Nablus governorate where 29 attacks were recorded. These attacks affected hundreds of dunums of citizens' lands. During the



reporting period, July 2025, there were 18 attempts by colonizers to establish colonial outposts in the governorates of Nablus, Tubas, Salfit, Ramallah & al Bireh,

Jenin, Bethlehem, Jericho and Hebron. Additionally, the Israeli occupation authorities and colonizers carried out 34 bulldozing lands' operations. These operations were concentrated in Ramallah & al Bireh Governorate, where 10 bulldozing lands' operations took place, followed by Nablus governorate which was subjected to 7 bulldozing lands' operations. Meanwhile, 5 bulldozing lands' operations were recorded in Hebron governorate.

### **Attacks on Trees:**

During the reporting period, July 2025, the Colonization & Wall Resistance Commission (CWRC) documented 64 attacks that targeted olive trees and caused the uprooting, poisoning and burning of 2844 trees among which there were 2647 olive trees. These attacks were concentrated in Hebron governorate where 22 attacks were recorded, followed by the governorate of Nablus which witnessed 16 attacks. Meanwhile, there were 15 attacks in Ramallah & al Bireh governorate.



### Attacks on Palestinians' Properties:

In July 2025, the CWRC documented 473 Israeli attacks on Palestinian property.

During this period, the occupying army and colonial militias carried out extensive campaigns to confiscate and steal citizens' property.



The targeted properties

included vehicles, camera recordings, bulldozers, solar panels, water tanks, livestock, and money. Furthermore, there were 268 incidents of property vandalism and 71 documented incidents of confiscations and thefts of properties during the reporting period. Specifically, Israeli forces confiscated 10 vehicles, two motorcycles, one surveillance camera, four agricultural tractors, seven trucks, eight cases of cash confiscation and theft, one water pump, and two cell phones. Meanwhile, the colonizers were involved in the theft of: 1,339 sheep, one donkey, one water pump, one air pump, one water tank, one instance of cash theft, six pieces of agricultural equipment, one agricultural tractor, four cases of stealing cell phones, one crop theft, and three cases of stealing solar panel.





**Colonizers' Attacks:** According to what was monitored and documented by the Colonization and Wall Resistance Commission (CWRC) during the reporting period, May 2025, the colonizers carried out 466 organized attacks. These attacks varied between the occupation army's protection of the colonists in their storming of Palestinian cities and communities, breaking into Palestinian villages, confiscating citizens' property, drawing racist slogans on the walls, and bulldozing

lands, as what happened in the villages Deir Istiya, Aqraba, Jalud, Qablan, Asira, Deir Ammar, Deir Nitham, Umm Safa, Sinjil, Birin, Umm al-Khair, Beit Ola, and Khallet al-Furn and other villages. The most prominent of these colonial attacks was storming the holy places; among which was the squares of Al-Aqsa Mosque in the occupied city of Jerusalem. During the reporting period, July 2025, 3400 Israeli colonizers, protected by the Israeli occupation army, carried out 25 raids into Al-Aqsa Mosque Squares. Besides, 2257 colonizers carried out provocative tours under what is called “tourism to the squares of Al-Aqsa Mosque”. Furthermore, the situation at the Ibrahimi Mosque in Hebron sharply deteriorated as occupation authorities implemented restrictions on prayer access and Prevented the call to prayer The Israeli actions taken against al Ibrahimi Mosque represent a blatant and unprecedented attack, provoking the feelings of Muslims and showing a disregard for the sanctity of religious rituals.

Notably worth, most of these attacks were concentrated in Ramallah & al Bireh Governorate which was subjected to 126 attacks, followed by Hebron Governorate where 103 attacks were recorded. Meanwhile, 83 attacks were documented in Nablus governorate.





### **Examples on the Colonizers' Attacks carried out in July 2025:**

**On July 1, 2025**, a group of colonizers from the so-called “Yitzhar” colony set fire to dozens of dunams of land in the village of Madama, located south of Nablus. They ignited fires along the bypass road, destroying hundreds of olive trees on agricultural land. Local residents and civil defense personnel rushed to control the fire. Reports indicated that the colonizers, along with the occupation army, prevented the crews from filling civil defense vehicles with water from the village well near the so-called “Al-Murabba'a” checkpoint.

**On July 1, 2025**, a group of colonizers established a new colonial outpost in Al-Ma'rajat area, northwest of Jericho. This marks the fifth outpost along Al-Ma'rajat road. They set up a tent, brought in water tanks and an electric generator, and began to fence the site. Reports indicate that the establishment of the outpost occurred under the protection of Israeli occupation soldiers, who provided digging equipment, while the colonizers started constructing iron fences.



**On July 2, 2025**, a group of colonizers unlawfully established a new colonial outpost on land that belongs to the village of Arab al-Malihah, situated northwest of Jericho,

just 150 meters east of the Arab al-Ka'abneh Elementary School. They constructed a livestock pen and brought in their flocks, along with mattresses and blankets for bedding. Furthermore, the initiation of this outpost's construction signifies a troubling escalation in their aggressive actions and ongoing harassment of local residents, undermining the peace and stability of the community.

**On July 3, 2025,** a group of colonizers, protected by Israeli occupation forces, stormed and vandalized the home of the citizen “Suleiman Musa” in the village of Arab al-Malihah, located northwest of Jericho. They forced him and his family to leave the house, breaking doors and windows and vandalizing furniture and personal belongings. The Israeli occupation forces stood by and offered them full protection during the attack. This incident followed a series of ongoing threats and restrictions that had forced Suleiman Musa to leave his home to ensure the safety of himself and his family.

**On July 4, 2025,** a group of colonizers, under the protection of Israeli occupation forces, launched an attack on an ambulance while attacking Mount Qammas, located between the town of Beita and the village of Osrin, south of Nablus. They targeted local citizens in the area who confronted



this attack, the thing which led to clashes that included the occupation soldiers and settlers firing live bullets and tear gas canisters. Fortunately, no injuries were reported. The Palestinian Red Crescent Society announced that the colonizers had damaged one of their ambulances while it was responding to an emergency in the area.



**On July 5, 2025,** a group of colonizers released their livestock onto olive trees and hay bales belonging to residents in Masafer Yatta. They targeted lands planted with olive trees in Sha'b al-Batm

area to destroy them. Additionally, they released their animals onto the hay bales owned by the citizen “Ibrahim Ali Awad” in Khirbet al-Tuba, following the destruction of several bales in the past.

**On July 6, 2025,** a group of colonizers renewed their dangerous attacks on Palestinian water sources in Ein Samia area, located east of the town of Kafr Malik, northeast of Ramallah. They stormed wells No. 2 and 3, vandalizing the surveillance cameras installed on the walls of the stations and destroying the gate at one of the sites. This attack directly threatens the



continuity of supplying water for citizens there, as “Ein Samia” wells are considered an essential source for dozens of Palestinian communities in Ramallah and Al-Bireh Governorate. It is important to note that any damage to these wells poses a serious threat to the fundamental human right to water for thousands of residents, particularly in light of the already challenging water conditions in these regions.



**On July 9, 2025,** a group of colonizers attacked the town of Surif, northwest of Hebron, assaulting residents and setting fire to agricultural land. The incident occurred in Al-Watwat area, near the so-called “Beit Ein” colony , which is built on privately owned Palestinian land. The colonizers carried out a series of attacks against residents and set fire to agricultural land.

**On July 10, 2025,** a bulldozer belonging to colonizers destroyed the pipeline between the villages of Aqraba and Majdal, south of Nablus. This pipeline supplies the villages of Jurish, Qusra, Qaryut, Jalud, Duma, Talfit, and Majdal Bani Fadel.

On July 11, 2025, Several citizens, including children, were injured and sustained bruises after being attacked by colonizers under the protection of the Israeli occupation army near the village of Al-Minya, southeast of Bethlehem. It was reported that the colonizers attacked about 10 homes in “Sa'ir valley” area near the village, and threw stones at them, damaging their windows and causing panic among the residents. Several citizens also suffered from suffocation after the Israeli occupation army fired tear gas canisters at the homes. The Palestinian Red Crescent indicated that it dealt with a 3-year-old girl who was injured in the head after being attacked by the colonizers there.

On July 11, 2025, A young man was martyred and others were injured due to colonizers’ attack on the town of Sinjil, north of Ramallah. The Ministry of Health stated that “Saif al-Din Kamil Abd al-Karim Muslat” (23 years old) from the town of al-Mazra'a al-Sharqiya was martyred after being severely beaten by colonizers in the town of Sinjil, north of Ramallah.



Furthermore, Dozens of colonizers attacked residents and foreign solidarity activists who were trying to reach Khirbet al-Tall in Jabal al-Batin to remove the colonial outpost there. This attack resulted in the injury of 10 citizens from the villages of Sinjil, al-Mazra'a al-Sharqiya, Obwein, and Jaljalia, north of Ramallah. An activist was also run over by a colonizer, and two ambulances were attacked, resulting in their windows being damaged.

**11-7-2025:** Mohammad Rizq Hussein Shalaby (23 years old), from Al-Mazra'a Ash-Sharqiyah Town, was martyred after being shot by the colonizers during their attack on the town of Sinjil, north of Ramallah. The live ammunition hit his chest and exited through his back. He was then left to bleed for hours as his whereabouts were unknown during the attack. He was later found by the people and the paramedics hours after his martyrdom.



**29-7-2025:** Oudeh Mohammad Khalil Al-Hathaleen (31 years old) was martyred as a direct result of a colonizer bullet during the colonizers' attack on the Umm Al-Kheer village east of Masafer Yatta, south of Hebron. The colonizers' attack happened while the residents were in their lands and inside their homes. The colonizers opened fire at them, which resulted in the martyrdom of Al-Hathaleen. He was then transferred by the occupation army to an unknown location until his martyrdom was announced.



**31-7-2025:** Colonizers, under the protection of the occupation army, attacked the town of Silwad and the villages of Abu Falah and Ramun, east of Ramallah. The aftermath of this attack was the martyrdom of Khamees Abd Al-Lateef Ayyad (40 years old) from the town of Silwad and the burning of several vehicles. Ayyad was martyred due to suffocation while he was attempting to extinguish the fire that the colonizers set to citizens' vehicles.




## Procedures and Practices of the Occupation Authorities against Palestinian Facilities

### A. Demolitions

According to the violations database of the Colonization & Wall Resistance Commission, during the period covered by the report of July 2025, the occupation authorities carried out a total of 75 demolition

operations, affecting 122 facilities across the West Bank, including Jerusalem. The majority of demolitions were concentrated in Jerusalem Governorate, where 20 demolitions destroyed 53 facilities. This was followed by Ramallah and Al-Bireh Governorate, with 16 demolitions leading to 22 demolished facilities, and Bethlehem Governorate, with 14 demolitions affecting 18 facilities. As demonstrated in the accompanying chart, demolitions were primarily concentrated in the southern and central West Bank.




However, when considering demolition orders (refer to the demolition notifications section), a strong correlation between issued notices and actual demolitions becomes evident, particularly in the southern West Bank. This region contains vast areas targeted by the occupation for displacement and depopulation in favour of colonial expansion. The demolitions during the period covered by the report affected various types of facilities, including inhabited residential homes, uninhabited and under-construction homes, agricultural facilities, mobile homes (caravans), commercial and industrial barracks, and water wells.



## B. Notifications (Demolition, Construction Moratorium, and Evacuation)

During the period covered by the report, July 2025, Israeli occupation authorities issued 33 notifications, ranging from demolition or construction moratorium orders due to lack of permits to eviction




notifications under the pretext of military training. The majority of these notifications were concentrated in Bethlehem Governorate, with 19 notifications, followed by Hebron Governorate with 6 notifications, and then Qalqilya and Tubas governorates with 3 notifications each.

The demolition notifications issued by the Israeli occupation authorities in the West Bank serve as one of the means it utilizes to restrict Palestinians in Area “C” and obstruct their development and urban expansion. In light of the occupation’s control of planning in these areas, they deny Palestinians their right to prepare master plans. Even when these master plans were submitted, they were rejected, preventing Palestinians from utilizing Area “C”, which constitutes 61% of the West Bank. This area is being kept for the expansion of colonies and as a strategic reserve for future use.

## Land Expropriation (Land Confiscation)

In July, the occupation authorities seized a total of 31 dunums of citizens' lands through 5 land seizure orders for alleged military purposes. These orders aim to establish 3 buffer zones, one around the Sidi Bo'ez colonial outpost, which was established on the Al-Khidr lands, another on the lands of Arab At-Ta'amreh in the Bethlehem Governorate, the third expands a previous order on the lands of Kafr Al-Libbad in the Tulkarm Governorate around the Avnei Hefetz colony. The other orders aimed at constructing colonial bypass roads in the Hebron Governorate, particularly on the lands of Ash-Shuykh and As-Sa'ir, and on the lands of Jinsafout in the Qalqilyah Governorate.


**First Order:** The occupation forces seized an area of 5.734 dunums of Kafr Al-Libbad village lands in the Tulkarm Governorate through a land seizure order under the pretext of military and security purposes. The military order that carries the number T\05\77 aims to resume the construction of a buffer zone around the Aveni Hefetz colony. Even though this order is not new, it was originally issued in 2005, the new addition ensures the establishment of this buffer zone by expanding its designated area.




**Second order:** The occupation forces seized an area of 5.758 dunums of Al-Khadir lands in the Bethlehem Governorate through a seizure order under the pretext of military and security purposes. This order that carries the number T\25\106 aims to establish a buffer zone around the Sidi Bo'er colonial outpost, established on privately owned citizens' lands in Al-Khadir.



**Third order:** the occupation forces seized an area of 6.757 dunums of land from Arab At-Ta'amreh lands in the Bethlehem Governorate through a seizure order under the pretext of military and security purposes. This order that carries the number T\25\116 aims to establish a buffer zone around Skonot B C colonial area. They allocated around 3.477 dunums of land in favor of the military order, which is the area in blue on the map.



**Fourth order:** the occupation forces seized an area of 5.163 dunums from the towns of Ash-Shuykh and Sa'ir in the Hebron Governorate through a seizure order under the pretext of military and security purposes. This order that carries the number T\25\105 aims to construct a colonial road that connects the colonies of Pene Kedem and Asfar (Mitsad). They allocated a total of 4.888 dunums of state land in favor of the military order, which is the area in blue on the map.



**Fifth order:** the occupation forces seized an area of 7.737 dunums of the lands of Jinsafut village in the Qalqilyah Governorate through a seizure order under the pretext of military and security purposes. This order that carries the number T\25\114 aims to construct a set of colonial road sections on the lands of the village to connect the locations of Ramat Gil'ad and Neve Menachem, while the other section connects between the colonies of Immanuel and the southern borders of Neve Menachem. They also allocated a total of 2.377 dunums of state land in favor of the military order, which is the area in blue on the map.



## Colonial Expansion Plans (Deposited and Approved)

Last July, the planning authorities in the occupation state studied 39 master plans in favor of the West Bank colonies and within the municipal boundaries of the occupation municipality in occupied Jerusalem. 34 master plans were studied of the West Bank colonies while 5 were studied for occupied Jerusalem colonies within municipal boundaries.

The planning authorities in the occupation state approved 22 master plans for West Bank colonies and deposited 12 others, approving the construction of 4492 new colonial units and depositing 1095 others on an area of 5268 dunums.

The occupation municipality in occupied Jerusalem approved one master plan and deposited 4 others in favor of occupied Jerusalem colonies within municipal boundaries. 260 colonial units were deposited while no new colonial units were approved. This plan targeted 46 dunums of citizens' lands.

### **First: Master Plans in the West Bank**

The maps attached to the master plans expose the occupation's intention to gradually legalize colonial outposts around the Eli colony, established on citizens' lands in the Qaryout, As-Sawiyeh, and Al-Libban villages in the Nablus Governorate. These outposts are "Nof Harim" and "Neve Shoham" through the depositing master plan number 1/ 6/ 237 that aims to establish 118 colonial units on an area of 26 dunums.

Meanwhile, the same plans reveal that the occupation state has approved a master plan for the "Ma'ale Amos" colony, built on citizens' land in the Bethlehem Governorate, specifically on territories belonging to Arab al-Rashayda. The plan

numbered יוש/2/4/413 aims to "legalize" the "Avi Hanahal" outpost by constructing 76 new colonial units on 112 dunums of confiscated citizens' land.

Additionally, the attached maps expose the occupation's intent to "legitimize" another colonial outpost, "Giv'at Hanan", by submitting a master plan numbered יוש/5/513. This scheme involves building 107 new colonial units on 132 dunums of citizens' land.

## Second: Master Plans and Colonial Bids of Colonial Units in Occupied Jerusalem

The planning authorities of the occupation state, represented by the District Committee of the Jerusalem Municipality, reviewed a total of 5 master plans aimed at colonial expansion in the colonies established in Jerusalem. They approved 1 plan and deposited 4 others, amounting to 260 colonial units that were deposited, with no new colonial units approved. This took place on an area estimated at 46 dunums of citizens' land.

## Laws and Bills proposed or approved by the Israeli Knesset in July 2025

In this part of the report, we review the most prominent of the laws and bills that were studied in the Occupation's Knesset. Considering the nature of these laws, their hostile and racist nature can be inferred, through which the legislative bodies in the occupation state seek to entrench a system of suppression against Palestinians or to perpetuate the racial segregation and apartheid imposed on them. In July, the commission documented one law that was approved with the final reading; it is the only law that was approved due to the Knesset's adjournment for summer recess

## Attitudes and Racist Statements by Prominent Characters in the Israeli Occupation State

**These days, leaders of the Israeli occupation have started making their racist statements unabashedly, revealing their superiority complexes and racist stances. In this section of the report, we quickly review the most prominent statements.**

- On July 2, 2025: The occupation's so-called Minister of Finance, Bezalel Smotrich, stated: "The real answer is sovereignty".<sup>2</sup>
- On July 3, 2025: The occupation's so-called Minister of Heritage of the Otzma Yehudit party stated: "We do not want a ceasefire".<sup>3</sup>
- On July 2, 2025: Tsvi Sukkot stated: "Sovereignty over Judea and Samaria is a historic opportunity for us to enforce".
- On July 3, 2025: Itamar Ben-Gvir: "We must occupy all of Gaza and encourage migration. Enough with the excuses - this is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity".<sup>4</sup>
- On July 5, 2025: The Minister of Innovation, Science, and Technology, Gila Gamliel stated: "There will be no a Palestinian state. I have no doubt that the immigration plan that I presented to the Cabinet during the first week of the war will be implemented".<sup>5</sup>

- On July 3, 2025: The occupation's Minister of War, Israel Katz, stated after the recent colonizers' attacks in the West Bank: "The Jew who burns a Palestinian's home is not a terrorist"<sup>6</sup>.
- On July 3, 2025: Ben-Gvir, at Channel 14's sovereignty conference: "I am not ready for a surrender deal in Gaza. I want full sovereignty".<sup>7</sup>
- On July 24, 2025: Smotrich stated: "I want to thank President Macron for providing yet another more compelling reason for finally enforcing Israeli sovereignty over the historical regions of Judea and Samaria and for putting an end for the dangerous delusion of the terrorist state of Palestine in the middle of Israel's land. This will be our legitimate zionist response to the unilateral pressures and coercive maneuvers of Macron".<sup>8</sup>
- On July 29, 2025: Otzma Yehudit member and deputy speaker of the Knesset, Limor Son Har-Melech, stated: "I came to court to support the hero of Israel, Yinon Levi. In a country that values life, those who protect their lives and the lives of their family receive a reward and are not dragged into extended detention."
- **Note:** Yinon Levi is the colonizer who murdered Oudeh Mohammad Khalil Al-Hathaleen (31 years old). Al-Hathaleen was a member of the teaching staff
