Foreword:

In October 2025, we witnessed a significant increase in violations committed by the Israeli occupation and its colonizers against our people, our land, and our holy places. This coincided with a continued policy of impunity and ongoing colonial expansion in various areas of the West Bank, including occupied Jerusalem.

During this month, the documentation team at the Colonization & Wall Resistance Commission (CWRC) reported 2,350 attacks carried out by the Israeli occupation army and colonizers. Of these, 766 attacks were directly perpetrated by colonizers against citizens and their property. This indicates the complicity of the Israeli military establishment with these groups, revealing that colonizers are being used as a tool to impose colonial realities on the ground.

The attacks included direct physical assaults, uprooting of trees, burning of fields, preventing olive harvesters from accessing their lands, seizing property, and demolishing homes and agricultural facilities. At the same time, the Israeli occupying forces strategically isolate vast areas of Palestinian land under the pretext of “security,” while enabling colonizers to expand their presence in these areas. The rise in violations clearly reveals that we are witnessing not mere isolated incidents, but a well-coordinated and systematic campaign carried out to displace the local population and enforce a deeply racist colonial system. As we present this report, we strongly reaffirm our commitment to relentless monitoring, thorough documentation, and pursuing international legal accountability. We will work hand in hand with our partners to safeguard the Palestinian presence in this land and confront the colonial project that poses a serious threat to the future of peace and justice in the region.



First: Violations of the Israeli Occupation State & Colonizers in the Occupied Palestinian Territories in October 2025:

During the reporting period, October 2025, the Colonization & Wall Resistance Commission (CWRC) monitored 2350 attacks. These attacks were carried out by the various bodies of the Israeli occupying state, including its colonial militia, against Palestinian citizens and their properties.


Of these, 1584 attacks were carried out by the Israeli army, while the colonizers perpetrated 766 attacks. These attacks included assaults and physical injuries, caused by live ammunition, gas, or terrorism. They also involved raids, vandalism, theft, property confiscation, land bulldozing, uprooting trees, and imposing closures and barriers that undermine the unity of Palestinian geography. However, the majority of these attacks occurred in the governorate of Ramallah & al-Bireh which witnessed 542 attacks.



This was followed by Nablus Governorate which witnessed 412 attacks. Meanwhile, 401 attacks were recorded in Hebron governorate. These governorates experienced intensive attacks, amounting to 58% of the total attacks. The other governorates faced a similarly difficult situation. Jerusalem governorate witnessed more than 200 attacks. Meanwhile, the governorates of Qalqilia, Tubas, Jenin and Bethlehem experienced over 100 attacks each.

These attacks included 517 attacks on property and holy places, 111 attacks on lands and natural resources, and 1722 attacks on citizens.


A comparison of the total Israeli violations during the past three months:



Attacks Perpetrated by the Israeli Occupation State & Colonizers against Palestinian Citizens, their Properties and Holy Places.

Attacks on citizens:

During the reporting period, October 2025, the Colonization & Wall Resistance Commission (CWRC) documented 1722 attacks on citizens. Most of these attacks were concentrated in Ramallah & al Bireh Governorate which witnessed 427 attacks,




followed by Hebron Governorate which witnessed 271 attacks. Meanwhile, there were 264 attacks in Nablus governorate. These attacks included shooting, arrest campaigns, shutting down checkpoints, intimidation, and imposing traffic restrictions on citizens.

Attacks on Lands & Natural Resources:

In October 2025, the Colonization & Wall Resistance Commission (CWRC) has documented 111 attacks on the Palestinian lands and natural resources¹. These attacks were concentrated in Hebron governorate which was subjected to 35 attacks, followed by Ramallah & al Bireh governorate where 24 attacks were recorded. Meanwhile, Nablus governorate witnessed 20 attacks.



These attacks affected hundreds of dunums of citizens' lands. During the reporting period, October 2025, there were 7 attempts by colonizers to establish colonial

outposts in the governorates of Nablus (4 attempts), and Hebron (3 attempts). Additionally, the Israeli occupation authorities and colonizers carried out 19 bulldozing lands' operations. These operations were concentrated in Hebron Governorate, where 6 bulldozing lands' operations took place, followed by Nablus governorate which was subjected to 4 bulldozing lands' operations. Meanwhile, 3 bulldozing lands' operations were recorded in Ramallah & al Bireh.

Attacks on Trees:

During the reporting period, October 2025, the Colonization & Wall Resistance Commission (CWRC) documented 85 attacks that targeted olive trees and caused the uprooting, poisoning, and burning of 1200 trees. These attacks were concentrated in Hebron governorate, where 26 attacks were recorded, followed by Ramallah & al-Bireh governorate, which witnessed 21 attacks. Meanwhile, 12 attacks were monitored in Nablus governorate.

Attacks on Palestinian Properties:

In October 2025, the CWRC documented 517 Israeli attacks on Palestinian property. During this period, the occupying army and colonial militias carried out extensive campaigns to confiscate and steal citizens 'property.

The targeted properties included vehicles, camera recordings, bulldozers, solar panels, water tanks, livestock, money, agricultural equipment and olive. Furthermore, there were 267 incidents of property vandalism and 167 documented incidents of confiscations and thefts of properties during the reporting period. These incidents included the following: 16 vehicles confiscated, 6 cases of confiscating surveillance camera recordings, 3 cases of confiscating agricultural tractors, 4 bulldozers, 2 cases of confiscation of cement mixers, theft of 4 sheep, 2 cases of theft involving 5 donkeys, 1 case of theft involving 2 camels, 1 case of theft involving 14 cows, 1 case of theft of 3 beehives, 108 cases of theft of olives, 32 cases of stealing agricultural equipment, 2 cases of stealing animal feed, 1 case of theft of work equipment, 2 cases of stealing 4 water pumps, 1 case of stealing firewood, 1 case of stealing solar panels, stealing a truck, 2 cases of stealing money and 4 cases of stealing 5 mobile phones.

The widespread operations of property confiscation and theft were concentrated in Ramallah and Al-Bireh Governorate, where 42 incidents have been reported. This was followed by Nablus Governorate, which recorded 41 operations, and Jenin Governorate with 29 operations.



Colonizers' Attacks: According to what was monitored and documented by the Colonization and Wall Resistance Commission (CWRC) during the reporting period, October 2025, the colonizers carried out 766 organized attacks. These terrorist attacks resulted in the martyrdom of the citizen Jihad Mohammad Ajaj (26 years old), in the town of Deir Jarir in Ramallah & Al-Bireh Governorate. He was killed in a direct shooting operation by colonizers in 8/10/2025. An armed colonizer threw stones at Palestinian vehicles traveling along the road between the village and the town of Silwad. When a group of young men from the village confronted him, he opened fire, tragically resulting in the martyrdom of one citizen and leaving three others injured, some with serious wounds and others moderately injuries. They were urgently transported to the Palestine Medical Complex in Ramallah for treatment.


Furthermore, these attacks varied between the occupation army's protection of the colonists in their storming of Palestinian cities and communities, breaking into Palestinian villages, confiscating citizens' property, drawing racist slogans on the walls, and bulldozing lands, as what happened in the lands of al Rihyya, al Mughayyir, the wilderness of Sa'ir, Al-Buwayra, Ein Yabroud, Masafer Yatta, Al-Matwi, Jit, Jalud, Asira al-Qibliya and other area.

The most prominent of these colonial attacks was storming the holy places; among which was the squares of Al-Aqsa Mosque in the occupied city of Jerusalem. During the reporting period, October 2025, 13312 Israeli colonizers,



protected by the Israeli occupation army, carried out 33 raids into Al-Aqsa Mosque Squares. Besides, 7272 colonizers carried out provocative tours under what is called “tourism to the squares of Al-Aqsa Mosque”. During the reporting period, attacks on the Ibrahimi Mosque in Hebron increased significantly. On October 8, 2025, colonizers, protected by Israeli occupation soldiers, stormed the Old City and the Ibrahimi Mosque, located in the heart of Hebron. They held a provocative march that began near the mosque and continued to the Osama Bin Munqith School, which had been seized by the Israeli occupation and converted into a rabbinical seminary, now renamed the "Beit Romano" colony. As the colonizers moved through the streets of the Old City, the Israeli occupation forces obstructed the movement of Palestinian citizens, preventing them from accessing their homes and closing several shops and roads leading to the Old City. Additionally, the so-called “Israeli Heritage Minister”, Amichai Eliyahu, along with the extremist Israeli National “Security Minister” Itamar Ben-Gvir, stormed the Ibrahimi Mosque, conducted Talmudic rituals, and raised the Israeli flag and a large menorah on the roof and facades of the mosque. These Israeli actions taken against al-Ibrahimi Mosque represent a blatant and unprecedented attack, provoking the feelings of Muslims and showing a

disregard for the sanctity of religious rituals. Notably worth, most of these attacks were concentrated in Ramallah & al Bireh Governorate which was subjected to 195 attacks, followed by Nablus governorate where 179 attacks were recorded. Meanwhile, 126 attacks were documented in Hebron governorate.



Examples on colonizers' attacks carried out in October 2025:

On October 1, 2025, a group of colonizers, from the so-called “Asfar and Kodovim” colonies, cut down more than 200 mature olive trees and over 100 fruit-bearing almond trees in the town of Sa'ir, located northeast of Hebron. They used



chainsaws to completely destroy the trees in the Umm al-Batim area of Wadi Sa'ir.

On October 6, 2025, a group of colonizers cut down about 120 olive trees in “Marj Si'a plain”, located between the villages of Al-Mughayyir and Abu Falah, northeast of Ramallah. They attacked the plain and destroyed trees that belonged to local residents, with some of the trees being over 60 years old.





On October 7, 2025, Israeli occupation forces and colonizers uprooted 150 olive trees in the village of Umm al-Khair, located in Masafer Yatta, south of Hebron in the southern West Bank. They stormed the village, uprooted the trees, and destroyed agricultural fencing and

barbed wire belonging to local residents near the so-called “Karmiel” colony, which was built on Palestinian land there.

On October 8, 2025, a group of colonizers attacked olive harvesters in the town of Aqraba, located south of Nablus. The colonizers, who were accompanied by the Israeli army, targeted olive pickers in the Qarqafa



area, south of Aqraba. Residents confronted them, the thing which led to clashes during which tear gas was fired. Reports indicate that a foreign activist suffered from suffocation due to the toxic gas used by the Israeli army. In a separate incident, a group of colonizers stole olives from lands in Burin, south of Nablus. Among the affected was Umm Ayman Sufan, whose property is adjacent to the so-called “Yitzhar” colony. She faces daily attacks from colonizers attempting to force her family to leave the area.



On October 8, 2025, armed colonizers attacked farmers in Wadi Sa'ir, northeast of Hebron, chased them, and stole their olive harvest. They blocked the main road, damaged several olive trees, and took the fruit. Residents and farmers in

Wadi Sa'ir are enduring relentless attacks from colonizers. Over 200 ancient olive trees and more than 100 fruitful almond trees have been cut down and destroyed. Furthermore, dozens of dunams filled with grapevines, olive trees, and almond trees have been set ablaze. These brutal attacks are clearly carried out to forcibly displace local citizens from their lands in a blatant effort to expand colonial control.



On October 8, 2025, colonizers, protected by Israeli occupation soldiers, stormed the Old City and the Ibrahimi Mosque, located in the heart of Hebron. They held a provocative march that began near the mosque and continued to the Osama Bin Munqith School, which had been seized by the Israeli occupation and converted into a rabbinical seminary, now renamed the "Beit Romano" colony. As the colonizers moved through the streets of the Old City, the Israeli occupation forces obstructed the movement of Palestinian citizens, preventing them from accessing their homes and closing several shops and roads leading to the Old City. Additionally, the so-called "Israeli Heritage Minister", Amichai Eliyahu, along with the extremist Israeli National "Security Minister" Itamar Ben-Gvir, stormed the Ibrahimi Mosque, conducted Talmudic rituals, and raised the Israeli flag and a large menorah on the roof and facades of the mosque.

On October 8, 2025, Jihad Muhammad Ajaj, 26, was martyred after being shot by a colonizer in the village of Deir Jarir, located east of Ramallah. Three other citizens sustained injuries that ranged from serious to moderate and were transferred to the Palestine Medical



Complex in Ramallah. The incident began when an armed colonizer started throwing stones at Palestinian vehicles on the road connecting Deir Jarir and the town of Silwad. When a group of young men from the village approached the colonizer, he opened fire, resulting in Ajaj's martyrdom and injuring the three others. One of the injured was shot in the thigh, while another sustained an abdominal injury. All were taken to the hospital for treatment.



On October 10, 2025, a Palestinian man was shot in the foot with live ammunition, and seven others were injured during an attack by colonizers on farmers in Beita, a town south of Nablus. The incident led to clashes with Israeli occupation forces. The

Palestinian Red Crescent reported that they treated seven individuals for injuries, including journalists Jaafar Ishtayeh and Wahaj Bani Mufleh, who were injured while covering the settlers' assault on olive harvesters in Beita. A group of colonizers attacked the Palestinians as they were picking olives in Jabal Qamas area of Beita. During the confrontation, they assaulted the farmers and set fire to four Palestinian vehicles, one of which belonged to AFP photographer Jaafar Ishtayeh. Additionally, the Red Crescent noted that Israeli soldiers stormed the area and fired stun grenades

and tear gas at the Palestinians, leading several individuals to suffer from tear gas inhalation.

On October 12, 2025, a group of colonizers cut down dozens of olive trees in the village of Al-Mughayyir, located east of Ramallah. They raided the “Marj Si'a” area, which is west of Al-Mughayyir and near the lands of the neighboring village of Abu Falah. They cut down 150 olive trees before leaving the area.



Earlier that same morning, the colonizers had grazed their sheep on land that is owned by Palestinians in the village.



On October 14, 2025, about 150 olive trees owned by “Sultan Rashid Mabsalt” in al Qa'oun Plain near the village of Bardala, located in the northern Jordan Valley, were damaged and cut down by colonizers. The area has recently experienced an increase in attacks by armed colonizers, who established an

outpost west of Bardala about a year and a half ago. Since then, they have been seizing grazing lands, burning Palestinian property, and destroying crops.

On October 14, 2025, a colonizer abducted four Palestinian youths from the village of Beit Ur al-Fauqa, located west of Ramallah. The abduction occurred near a colonial outpost that was built on Palestinian land in Wadi Suleiman, close to the neighboring village of al-Tira. The colonizer assaulted the youths. Israeli occupation forces intervened to protect the settler and, in the process, assaulted Palestinians who tried to rescue the abducted youths, injuring four of them. Additionally, the Israeli occupation forces arrested two of the abducted youths: Khaled Munif Samara and

Muhammad Ibrahim Samara. The same colonizer had assaulted another young man from the village the day before and had attempted to abduct him as well.

On October 20, 2025, a group of colonizers began to fence off land in the northern Jordan Valley in preparation for seizing areas around Umm al-Quba, Samra, and al-Marmala. The fenced-off area is estimated to exceed 4,000 dunams and is officially registered in the land registry (Tabu) to over 300 families. The northern Jordan Valley is experiencing a significant increase in colonizers' attacks on Palestinian citizens and their property. These attacks involve raiding and intimidating residents, assaulting them, destroying their property, harassing them in grazing areas, preventing access to their lands, and stealing or attacking their livestock.

On October 19, 2025, a colonizer assaulted (53-year-old), Afaf Abu Aliya, striking her on the head and causing her to lose consciousness. She was later taken to a hospital for treatment, where her condition was reported as stable. The attack occurred



while she was picking olives east of Ramallah. Throughout the olive harvest, colonizers had been attacking and chasing farmers; however, Ms. Abu Aliya had lagged behind. A colonizer attacked her with a stick, striking her on the head until she lost consciousness. He then proceeded to assault two international solidarity activists at the same location, resulting in one of them suffering a broken arm. Ms. Abu Aliya was among dozens of Palestinian families harvesting olives in the town of Turmusa'ya, accompanied by international solidarity activists, in fields near Israeli colonies.

On October 24, 2025: Colonizers set fire to three vehicles in the town of Deir Dibwan east of Ramallah. The colonizers attacked At-Tal area in Deir Dibwan, set fire to the three vehicles, then fled the scene.



On October 25, 2025: A number of farmers suffered from suffocation and burns due to being sprayed with pepper spray by colonizers in the town of Kafr Malik east of Ramallah. The colonizers attacked the farmers, who were accompanied by foreign solidarity activists, and a delegation from the Colonization & Wall Resistance Commission in the area of “Al-Manateer” and prevented them from accessing their lands.



On October 26, 2025: The colonizers plowed hundreds of dunums of citizens’ lands in the As-Sika Village and Beit Awwa Town, west of Hebron, in preparation to seize them. Groups of colonizers from the “Negohot” colony attacked citizens’ agricultural lands east of the village and plowed more than 500 dunums during the past few days. The colonizers plan to seize the lands they plow, estimated at more than 1000 dunums of fertile land. These lands span over the As-Sika village and the town of Beit Awwa and are owned to a large number of families, and the cultivation of these lands constitutes a primary source of income for them.



On October 31, 2025: Colonizers stormed the main entrance of the Deir Dibwan Town east of Ramallah, burned two vehicles, and vandalized a mosque. They attacked the neighborhood of “Al-Marah” which is situated at the main western entrance of the town during Friday prayer, burned two vehicles, and attempted to invade a mosque in the neighborhood and shattered its external windows. The mosque is usually closed during Friday prayers and no one was inside.




On October 31, 2025: The occupation forces and colonizers attacked the citizens of Kafr Qaddum, east of Qalqilya, while the colonizers burned two vehicles in the same area. The occupation forces attacked the northern part of the town, known as “Ash-Shami Face”, fired live ammunition, stun grenades, and toxic tear gas at citizens. Moreover, dozens of colonizers, under the protection of the occupation army, attacked the same area and set fire to three vehicles, one of which was a government vehicle belonging to the “Coordinator of Popular Resistance” in Kafr Qaddum, Murad Ishteivi, in addition to burning two agricultural tractors and a bulldozer, which led to violent clashes breaking out at the location.



Second: Procedures and Practices of the Occupation Authorities against Palestinian Facilities

A. Demolitions

According to the violations database of the Colonization & Wall Resistance Commission, during October 2025, the




occupation authorities carried out a total of 25 demolition operations, affecting 28 facilities across the West Bank, including Jerusalem. The majority of demolitions were concentrated in Jerusalem Governorate, where 6 demolitions destroyed 7 facilities. This was followed by the Nablus Governorate, with 4 demolitions lead to 5 demolished facilities, then the Salfit Governorate, with 3 demolitions lead to 4 demolished facilities.

When considering demolition orders (refer to the demolition notifications section), a strong correlation between issued notices and actual demolitions becomes evident, particularly in the southern West Bank. This region contains vast areas targeted by the occupation for displacement and depopulation in favor of colonial expansion. The demolitions during the period covered by the report affected various types of facilities, including inhabited residential homes, uninhabited and under-construction homes, agricultural facilities, mobile homes (caravans), commercial and industrial barracks, and water wells as is demonstrated by the following table.


A comparison showcasing the number of demolitions and demolished facilities carried out by the Israeli occupation authorities during the past three months:



B. Notifications (Demolition, Construction Moratorium, and Evacuation)

During the period covered by the report, October 2025, Israeli occupation authorities issued 30 notifications, ranging from demolition or construction moratorium orders due to lack of permits to eviction notifications under the pretext of military training.

The majority of these notifications were concentrated in the Hebron Governorate, with 20 notifications, followed by the Jerusalem Governorate with 8 notifications, and then Bethlehem and Jenin governorates with 1 notification each.



The demolition notifications issued by the Israeli occupation authorities in the West Bank serve as one of the means it utilizes to restrict Palestinians in Area “C” and obstruct their development and urban expansion. In light of the occupation’s control of planning in these areas, they deny Palestinians their right to prepare master plans. Even when these master plans were submitted, they were rejected, preventing Palestinians from utilizing Area “C”, which constitutes 61% of the West Bank. This area is being kept for the expansion of colonies and as a strategic reserve for future use.

Second: Land Expropriation (Land Confiscation)


In October of this year, the occupation authorities seized a total of 244.816 dunums of citizens' land through 13 seizure orders for military purposes. These orders aimed to establish a buffer zone around colonies in the following governorates: Ramallah, Nablus, Qalqilya, Salfit, Tulkarm. In addition to establishing barbed-wire fences and new colonial roads. Some of the areas seized by the military orders were designated as state lands. Previous orders a

that were issued in 2005 and 2006 were amended by adding new areas to them for the purpose of securely closing colonies under the pretext of buffer zones.


First order: The occupation state seized an area of 5.856 dunums of citizens' lands from the town of Anata in the Jerusalem Governorate through a military order under the pretext of "land seizure order". The military order carrying the number T/65/25 seizes an area of 5.856 dunums of the town's land and aims at constructing a colonial road to connect the colony of Neve Brat to Route no. 437.



Second order: The occupation state seized an area of 29.68 dunums of citizens' lands from the towns of Kafr Malik and Deir Jarir in the Ramallah Governorate for the purpose of establishing a buffer zone around the colony of Kokhav HaShahar. The military order carried the number T/116/24.



Third order: The occupation state seized an area of 12.612 dunums of citizens' lands from the town of Deir Jarir in the Ramallah Governorate for the purpose of constructing a colonial road that connects the colony of Kokhav HaShahar and Route no. 449. The military order carried the number T/118/24.



Fourth order: The occupation state seized an area estimated at 2.203 dunums of citizens' lands of the village of At-Tayba east of the Ramallah Governorate for the purpose of establishing a barbed-wire fence along the road leading to the colony of Remonim. The military order carried the number T/74/25.




Fifth order: the occupation state seized an area of 18.279 dunums of the Ras Karkar Village lands in the Ramallah Governorate with the aim of establishing a buffer zone

around the colony of Talmun. The military order, carrying the number T/35/06, is an amendment to a previous order issued in 2006. The amendment was to cancel certain areas seized by the order and add others. This includes allocating an area of 12.61 dunums declared as state land in favor of the military order to tightly close the buffer zone around the colony.




Sixth order: The occupation state seized an area of 10.984 dunums of citizens' lands from the town of Deir Jarir in the Ramallah Governorate for the purpose of constructing a colonial road that connects the colony of Kokhav HaShahar and Route no. 449. The military order carried the number T/118/24.



Seventh Order: The occupation state seized a total of 70.147 dunums through a land seizure order for military and security purposes. The order targeted lands from


the villages of Qaryout, al-Libban Ash-Sharqi, and As-Sawyia in the Nablus Governorate for the purpose of establishing a buffer zone around the colony of Eli. Even though this military order, carrying the number T/136/25, shows that the total area confiscated is 70 dunums and 147 meters, of this 15.778 dunums were already classified as state land were allocated for the military order. The occupation state seized a total of 54.268 dunums under the new order.




Eighth order: The occupation state seized an area of 11.337 dunums of citizens' lands of the villages of Ni'lin and Deir Qaddis west of Ramallah Governorate for the purpose of establishing a barbed-wire fence to separate these villages from the colony of Mattityahu. The military order carried the number T/162/25.




Ninth order: The occupation state seized a total of 24.142 dunums from the lands of Beitill in the Ramallah Governorate. The military order, carrying the number T/05/70, aims to establish a buffer zone around the Nahliel colony. After analyzing the military order, it is apparent that the occupation authorities have expanded a previous order issued back in 2007 in the same area by adding the above-mentioned area to the original area, which is estimated at 17 dunums.



Tenth order: This order targeted 16.147 dunums of the lands of Kafr Al-Libbad in the Tulkarm Governorate for the purpose of establishing a buffer zone around the Avnei Hefetz colony. The military order indicates that this order is an amendment to a previous order issued in 2005. It cancels some areas of the order and adds new areas for the purpose of expanding the order. 6.848 dunums, declared as state land, were allocated in favor of the military order to consolidate the buffer zone around the colony. The military order carried the number T/77/05.



Eleventh order: This order targeted an area of 3.712 dunums of Azzun lands east of Qalqilya for the purpose of constructing a colonial security road that connects the colonies of Alfei Manshei and what is referred to as the Eliyahu crossing. This order carried the number T/49/25.




Twelfth order: This order targeted an area of 18.41 dunums of the lands from Sarta, Kafr Ad-Deik, and Burqin villages in the Salfit Governorate for the purpose of establishing a buffer zone around the colony of Brukhin. The military order indicates the allocation of a total of 11.791 dunums of lands already declared as state lands in favor of the military order which consolidates the buffer zone around the colony. The military order carried the number T/84/24.



Thirteenth order: This order targets an area of 21.307 dunums from the lands of Azzun and Jayyus in the Qalqilya Governorate for the purpose of establishing a buffer zone around the colony of Tsuvim east of the city. The military order indicates the allocation of a total of 6.513 dunums of lands declared as state lands in favor of

the military order which further consolidates the buffer zone around the colony. The military order carries the number T/85/25.



Third: Laws and Bills proposed or approved by the Israeli Knesset in October 2025

In this part of the report, we review the most prominent of the laws and bills that were studied in the Occupation's Knesset. Considering the nature of these laws, their hostile and racist nature can be inferred, through which the legislative bodies in the occupation state seek to entrench a system of suppression against Palestinians or to perpetuate the racial segregation and apartheid imposed on them.

Fourth: Colonial Expansion Plans (Approved and Deposited)

Last October, the planning authorities in the occupation state studied 19 master plans in favor of the West Bank colonies and within the municipal boundaries of the occupation municipality in occupied Jerusalem. 12 master plans were studied of the West Bank colonies while 7 were studied for occupied Jerusalem colonies within municipal boundaries.

The planning authorities in the occupation state approved 8 master plans for West Bank colonies (including issuing the approval for two plans for the E1 project) and deposited 4 others, approving the construction of 3524 new colonial units on an area of 2233.138 dunums.

The occupation municipality in occupied Jerusalem approved 2 master plan and deposited 5 others in favor of occupied Jerusalem colonies within municipal boundaries, with new 1205 colonial units. This plan targeted 28.549 dunums of citizens' lands.

Second: Master Plans and Colonial Bids of Colonial Units in Occupied Jerusalem

The planning authorities of the occupation state, represented by the District Committee of the Jerusalem Municipality, reviewed a total of 7 master plans aimed at colonial expansion in the colonies established in Jerusalem. They approved 2 plans and deposited 5 others, amounting to 1205 colonial units. This took place on an area estimated at 28.549 dunums of citizens' land.

Fifth: Attitudes and Racist Statements by Prominent Characters in the Israeli Occupation State

These days, leaders of the Israeli occupation have started making their racist statements unabashedly, revealing their superiority complexes and racist stances. In this section of the report, we quickly review the most prominent statements.

- On October 3, 2025: So-called “Minister of National Security”. Itamar Ben-Gvir, stated on X platform: “The Prime Minister's decision to allow the terror supporters on the flotilla to return to their countries is fundamentally wrong. I think they must be kept here for a few months in the Israeli prison, so that they can smell the scent of the terrorist wing.”²
- On October 10, 2025: MK Tsvi Suktot wrote on X platform: “I want to kill all the terrorists (detainees), and if not, let them languish in prison until the end of their days.”³
- On October 12, 2025: MK Tsvi Suktot stated on X platform: “Tens of thousands of houses in Gaza with the image of the mosque (Al-Aqsa) are now destroyed.”⁴

- On October 16, 2025: Gila Gamliel, the Minister of Science, stated on X platform: “Anyone who poses a threat to the citizens of the State of Israel is worthy of death.”⁵
- On October 16, 2025: The Nachala colonial organization wrote on Facebook: ““We are packed, birth bag for Gaza settlement - ready!”⁶
- On the same day, Daniella Weiss, founder of the Nachala colonial organization, posted on Facebook: “What is obvious is that there should be Jewish presence in Gaza.”⁷
- On October 18, 2025: Ben-Gvir stated on X platform: “Death penalty law for terrorists, now!”⁸
- On October 19, 2025: Ben-Gvir stated on X platform: “I welcome the Prime Minister's decision to halt humanitarian aid to the Gaza Strip. This aid does not need to be resumed, the war does - as soon as possible.”⁹
- On the same day, the so-called “Minister of Colonization”, Orit Strock, stated on X platform: “The war must be renewed, and it must be won!”¹⁰
- On October 19, 2025: The Nachala colonial organization posted on Facebook: “Like in Oslo, like in deportation, again paying with Jewish blood for visions

of peace. Gaza is ours! Only the occupation of Gaza, the expulsion of the enemy and Jewish settlement in all its territories will defeat the enemy from the south and send a clear message to all the enemies of Israel!”¹¹

- On the same day, Limor Son-Har, Deputy Speaker of the Knesset, posed on Facebook: “Only settlement will bring victory. Only annexation will bring security.”¹²
- On the same day, Yossi Dagan posted on Facebook: “A march for sovereignty in Samaria. 50 years of colonization in Samaria – a march towards Sebastia from Gush Emunim. We will fight and impose sovereignty.”¹³
- On October 21, 2025: The Nachala colonial organization posted on Facebook: “The talk of the hour – Jewish colonization in the Gaza Strip and no other tricks will bring back the history of the Israeli nation.”¹⁴
- On October 22, 2025: The infamous Israeli Minister of Finance, Bezalel Smotrich, stated on Facebook: “It is time to impose sovereignty over all the lands of Judea and Samaria – our ancestral land.”¹⁵

- On October 23, 2025: Mk Amichai Chikli stated during his visit to the Beit El Council complex via Facebook: “The terrorist Palestinian Authority – a huge deception that blew in our faces.”¹⁶
- On the same day, Shai Alon, the Beit El Council Head, stated: “The first step is to immediately dismantle the Palestinian Authority, because its presence prevents the true solution to terrorism and gives it the political oxygen it needs.”¹⁷
- On October 24, 2025: Bezalel Smotrich posted on Facebook: “Only military pressure brings the hostages back.”¹⁸
- On October 25, 2025: Smotrich posted on Facebook: “Thanks to the Council of Judea and Samaria and the Israeli Knesset and to all who support imposing sovereignty and eliminating of the idea of the dangerous Palestinian state.”¹⁹
- On October 28, 2025: Tsvi Sukkot posted on X platform: “The village of Umm al-Khir = an illegal Hamas supporter center from recent years, established partly on the lands of the Karmel colony and adjacent to the fence, a regional anarchist center and a lawbreaker from start to finish. It's time to solve this problem.”²⁰
