**Foreword:**

In May 2026, attacks by the Israeli army and colonizers included direct physical assaults on Palestinian civilians, the uprooting of trees, the burning of fields, the confiscation of property, and the demolition of residential and agricultural facilities. During this time, Israeli forces continued to close off large areas of Palestinian land under security pretexts while simultaneously allowing colonizers to expand and take control over those same areas. This situation reflects a clear policy aimed at reducing Palestinian territory and supporting colonial expansion at the expense of Palestinian land and rights.

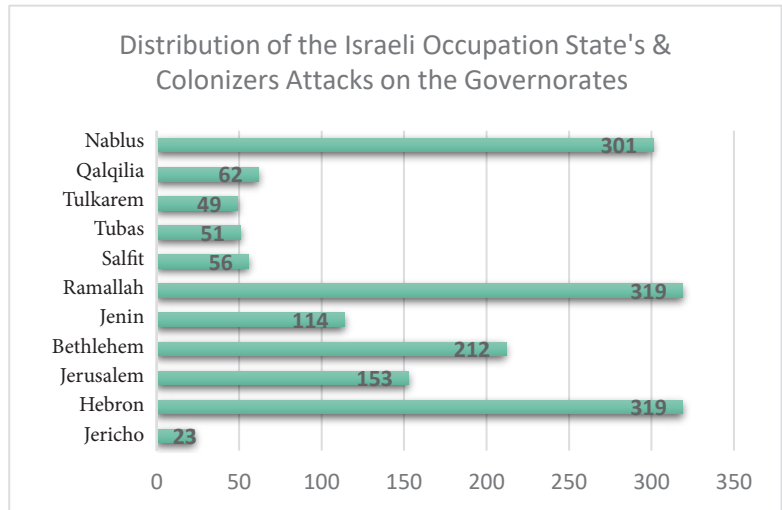
This monthly report highlights a troubling escalation in attacks by colonizers targeting Palestinians. These acts are not merely about damaging property; they disrupt lives and threaten the very fabric of communities. By aiming to impose a coercive environment, these attacks are designed to force people out of their homes, depriving them of their rights and dignity. What's particularly concerning is the clear collaboration between colonizer groups and the authorities in power. The colonizers carry out their attacks under the protection of the Israeli forces, which emboldens their actions. This coordinated effort seeks to establish irreversible changes on the ground, tighten colonial control, and reshape the landscape to serve their expansionist goals. Consequently, these actions severely undermine the possibility of a peaceful Palestinian state that respects the rights and aspirations of its people.

**First: Violations of the Israeli Occupation State & Colonizers in the Occupied Palestinian Territories in May 2026:**

During the reporting period in May 2026, the Colonization & Wall Resistance Commission (CWRC) monitored 1,659 attacks. These attacks were carried out by the various bodies of the Israeli occupying state, including its colonial militia, against Palestinian citizens and their properties. Of these, 1108 attacks were carried out by the Israeli army, while the colonizers perpetrated 551 attacks. These attacks included assaults and physical injuries, caused by live ammunition, gas, or terrorism. They also involved raids, vandalism, theft, property confiscation, land bulldozing, uprooting trees, and imposing closures and barriers that undermine the unity of Palestinian geography.



However, the majority of these attacks occurred in the governorate of Ramallah & al-Bireh which witnessed 319 attacks. This was followed by Nablus Governorate which witnessed 301 attacks. Meanwhile, 212 attacks were recorded in Bethlehem governorate. These governorates experienced intensive attacks, amounting to 69% of the total attacks. The other governorates faced a similarly difficult situation. The governorates of Jenin and Jerusalem witnessed about 100 attacks each.

These attacks included 436 attacks on property and holy places, 177 attacks on lands and natural resources, and 1046 attacks on citizens.

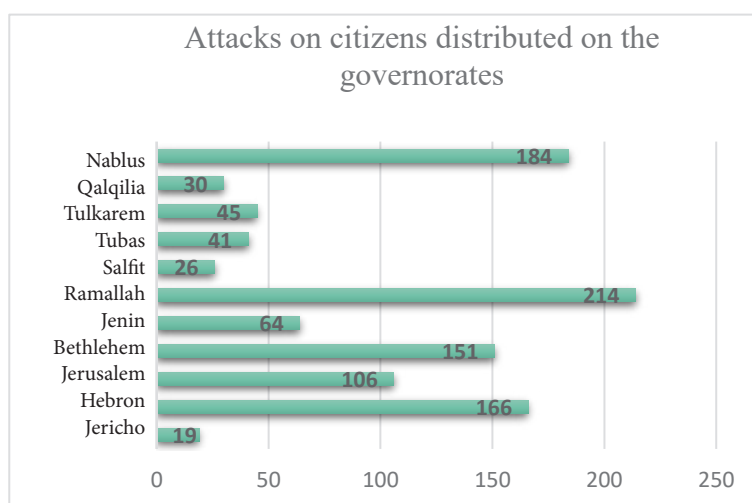
A comparison of the total Israeli violations during the past three months



**Attacks Perpetrated by the Israeli Occupation State & Colonizers against Palestinian Citizens, their Properties and Holy Places.**

**Attacks on citizens:**

During the reporting period, May 2026, the Colonization & Wall Resistance Commission (CWRC) documented 1046 attacks on citizens. Most of these attacks were concentrated in Ramallah & al Bireh which witnessed 214 attacks, followed by Nablus Governorate which witnessed 184 attacks. Meanwhile, there were 166 attacks in Hebron governorate. These attacks included shooting, arrest campaigns, shutting down checkpoints, intimidation, and imposing traffic restrictions on citizens.

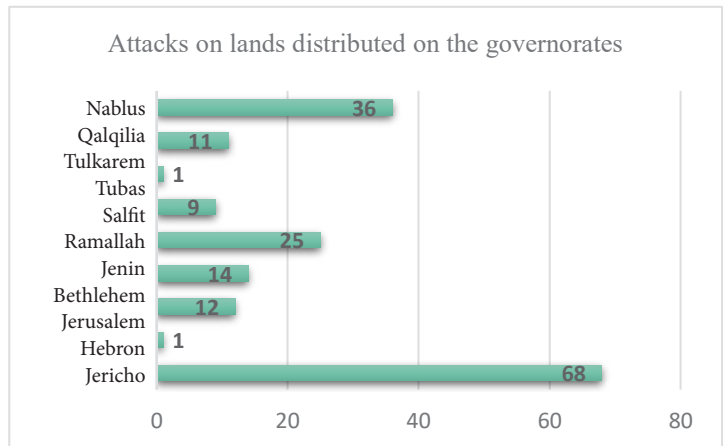

### **Attacks on Lands & Natural Resources:**

In May 2026, the Colonization & Wall Resistance Commission (CWRC) has documented 177 attacks on the Palestinian lands and natural resources<sup>1</sup>. These attacks were concentrated in Hebron governorate which was subjected to 68 attacks, followed by Nablus governorate, where 36 attacks were recorded. Meanwhile, Ramallah & al Bireh governorate witnessed 25 attacks.

These attacks affected hundreds of dunums of citizens' lands. During the reporting period, May 2026, there were 12 attempts by colonizers to establish colonial outposts in the governorate of Nablus (6 attempts). Meanwhile, there were 2 attempts to establish colonial outposts in Salfit governorate, 1 attempt to establish colonial outposts in Ramallah, Bethlehem, Hebron, and Qalqilia for each

Additionally, the Israeli occupation authorities and colonizers carried out 41 bulldozing lands' operations. These operations were concentrated in Hebron Governorate, where 15 bulldozing lands' operations took place, followed by Nablus Governorate, which was subjected to 9 bulldozing lands' operations. Meanwhile, 7 bulldozing lands' operations were recorded in Jenin governorate.



### **Attacks on Trees:**

During the reporting period, May 2026, the Colonization & Wall Resistance Commission (CWRC) documented 124 attacks that targeted olive trees and caused the uprooting, poisoning, and burning of 7222 trees. Of which there were 3317 olive trees. These attacks were concentrated in Hebron governorate, where 52 attacks were recorded, followed by Ramallah & al-Bireh governorate, which witnessed 23 attacks. Meanwhile, 21 attacks were monitored in Nablus governorate.

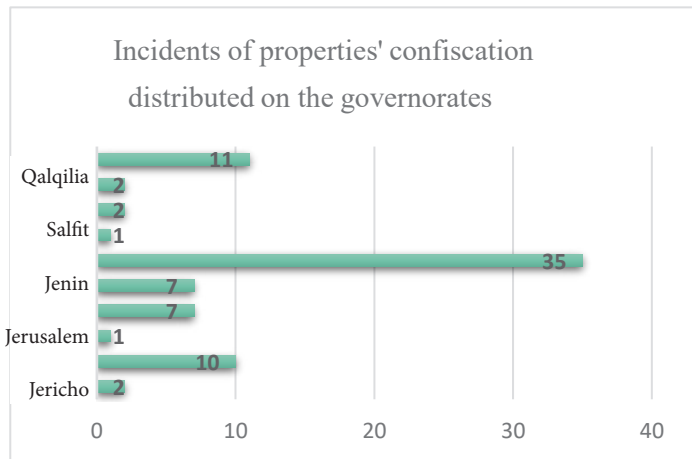

**Attacks on Palestinian Properties:**

In May 2026, the CWRC documented 436 Israeli attacks on Palestinian property. During this period, the Israeli occupying army and colonial militias carried out extensive campaigns to confiscate and steal citizens 'property. The number of property vandalism incidents during the reporting period was 215. During the reporting period, May 2026, there were 78 incidents of property confiscation and theft carried out by the Israeli occupation army and colonizers. These incidents included: 15 vehicles, 3 cases involving the confiscation of



surveillance camera recordings, 2 cases of theft involving 3 horses, 1 case of theft involving 3 donkeys, 2 cases of confiscation involving 2 bulldozers, the theft of 2,154 sheep, 29 cases of theft of agricultural equipment, 3 cases of confiscation and theft of sums of money, 6 cases of confiscation and theft of agricultural tractors, 5 cases involving the theft or confiscation of hand tools, 1 case of theft of an electric generator, 9 cases involving the theft and confiscation of 8 phones, a camera drone, and computers, 2 cases of house seizure, 1 case of seizure of residential caves, 1 case of seizure of a vehicle garage, 1 case of seizure of land, 1 case of theft of crops, 1 case of theft of a mobile room, 2 cases of theft of building materials, 1 case of confiscation of children's toys

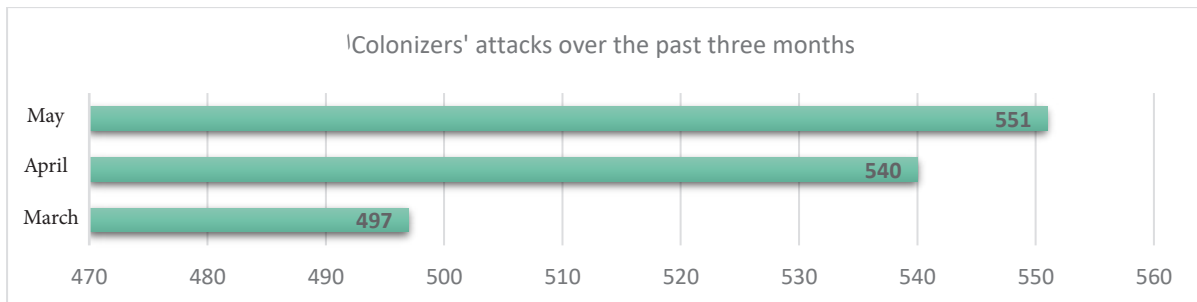
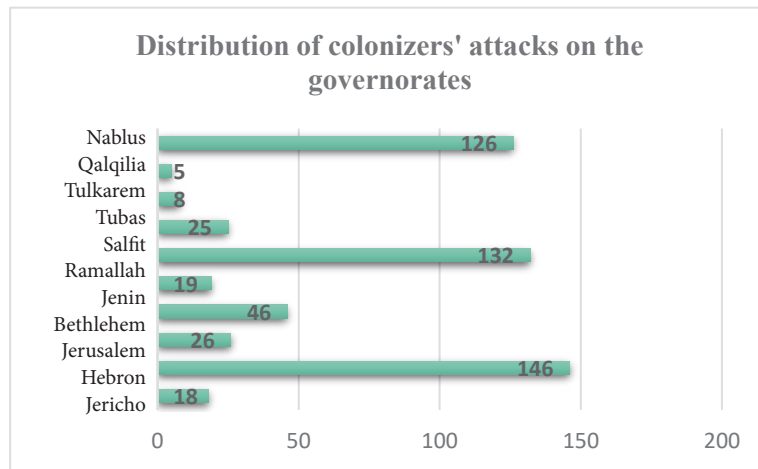
The widespread operations of property confiscation and theft were concentrated in Ramallah & al Bireh Governorate, where 35 incidents have been reported. This was followed by Nablus Governorate, which recorded 11 operations, and Hebron Governorate with 10 operations.

**Colonizers' Attacks:** According to what was monitored and documented by the Colonization and Wall Resistance Commission (CWRC) during the reporting period, May 2026, the colonizers carried out 551 organized attacks. Furthermore, these attacks varied between the occupation army's protection of the colonists in their storming of Palestinian cities and communities, breaking into Palestinian villages, confiscating citizens' property, drawing racist slogans on the walls, and bulldozing lands, as what happened in the villages of Beit Awa, Marj Si', Halhul, Yatta, Beit Imrin, Hawara, Deir Istiya, Beit Furik, Wadi al-Matwi, Qaryut, Beit Dajan, Einabus, Burin and many other areas.

Worth noting, most of these attacks were concentrated in Hebron governorate which was subjected to 146 attacks, followed by Ramallah & al Birih governorate where 132 attacks were recorded. Meanwhile, 126 attacks were documented in Nablus governorate



### **Examples on the Colonizers' Attacks carried out in May 2026:**

**On May 2, 2026,** a child and a young man were injured during an attack by colonizers at Khirbet al-Hadidiya in the northern Jordan Valley. The colonizers assaulted the residents, using pepper spray, which resulted in injuries to a 9-year-old child and a 34-year-old man.

**On May 3, 2026,** a group of colonizers began constructing a colonial road in the town of Beit Awa, located west of Hebron. They used heavy machinery to pave the road on land belonging to “al-Awawda and al-Suwaiti” families in the Tuwas and Sikka areas, near the military tower at the town's entrance. Additionally, they seized hundreds of dunams of land west of the town of Dura to build colonial roads that were forcibly established in the area.

**On May 5, 2026,** an armed colonizers stormed “Silat al-Dhahr Boys' School”, located south of Jenin. He drove his vehicle into the schoolyard and pursued students and teachers while brandishing his weapon, causing panic and fear among the students.

**On May 7, 2026,** a group of colonizers began establishing a new outpost near Bruqin, located northwest of the town's schools and residents' homes. The colonizers started construction on the outpost south of the bypass road, approximately 100 meters from the Bruqin Girls' Basic School and the Bruqin Boys' Basic School, and about 50 meters from nearby homes. This bypass road connects the colonies of Bruchin and Bedu'el, both of which are built on the town's land. The establishment of this new outpost poses a direct threat to the town's residents and schoolchildren, particularly because it is located close to 13 families in the area. This colonial expansion exacerbates the citizens' suffering and increases the number of the colonizers' attacks.

**On May 8, 2026,** a group of colonizers set fire to a house in the village of Al-Lubban Al-Sharqiya, located south of Nablus. The house, which belongs to the citizen “Muhammad Al-Khalil”, is situated on the road connecting the cities of Nablus and Ramallah. Civil defense crews quickly arrived to control the blaze.





**On May 8, 2026**, a Palestinian man and his child were injured in Khirbet Shuweika, south of Hebron, after being attacked by colonizers. The colonizers attacked the citizen “Murad al-Batat” and his child with sharp objects while they were on their land, resulting in head injuries that required hospitalization. They also vandalized al-Batat’s vehicle, smashing its windows and causing serious damage.

**On May 9, 2026**, two Palestinian women were injured during an attack by colonizers on the village of Jurish and the town of Aqraba, located south of Nablus. The colonizers threw stones at Palestinian homes in “Wadi al-Hajj Issa” area, which lies between Jurish and Aqraba. The Palestinian Red Crescent Society reported that they treated two individuals: a 35-year-old pregnant woman and a 65-year-old woman, both of whom were injured in this attack.

**On May 13, 2026**, thousands of colonizers stormed Joseph’s Tomb, located east of Nablus. Over 5,000 colonizers, including the extremist Israeli Finance Minister Bezalel Smotrich and several members of the Knesset, stormed the site while multiple checkpoints surrounding the city were closed. They also drew racist slogans on the wall of the Qadri Touqan Secondary School for Boys, located near Joseph’s Tomb.

**On May 14, 2026**, a group of colonizers forced a Bedouin family to leave their home west of the village of Al-Auja, located north of Jericho. The family, led by Ibrahim Suleiman Kaabneh and consisting of seven members, had previously been displaced from the area of Furush Beit Dajan. This recent action forced them to flee once again, this time towards the northern Jordan Valley.

**On May 14, 2026**, a group of colonizers started bulldozing agricultural land in “Wadi al-Matwi” area, situated between the city of Salfit and the town of Bruqin, to the west of the governorate. Reports indicate that the bulldozing has impacted cultivated land in order to expand new colonial roads in the region.



**On May 14, 2026**, a provocative “Flag March” stormed the Damascus Gate area, one of the most famous gates of the Old City of occupied Jerusalem. The event saw the participation of thousands of colonizers, all under the protection of the Israeli occupation police. Among those participating were ministers and Knesset members from the governing coalition, including the so-called Minister of National Security, Itamar Ben-Gvir, and the extremist Minister of Finance, Bezalel Smotrich. They were accompanied by a group of officials from the Israeli occupation police and army, as well as other extremist Knesset members.

The colonizers raised Israeli flags and displayed banners with racist slogans that called for violence against Arabs and threatened to build the “alleged temple” in place of Al-Aqsa Mosque. During the march, they attacked several citizens and journalists present at the scene, spitting on them, hurling insults, and engaging in flag-waving dances.



**On May 15, 2026**, a group of colonizers attacked the village of Jibya, located northwest of Ramallah. They burned a mosque and two vehicles belonging to residents Muhammad Naim Shanani and Amr Saber Shalash. Additionally, They drew racist slogans on the walls of houses.

**On May 15, 2026**, a group of colonizers set fire to two vehicles and vandalized four others, along with two agricultural facilities, during an attack on the village of Shuqba, a town located west of Ramallah. The colonizers targeted the western side of the village, setting fire to two vehicles and smashing the windows of four others. They also vandalized two agricultural facilities while several residents were present inside. The colonizers withdrew as Israeli occupation forces arrived in the area.



**On May 18, 2026**, a group of colonizers, protected by Israeli occupation forces, set fire to agricultural land in the village of Al-Mughayyir, located northeast of Ramallah. The fires were ignited on the eastern plain, destroying most of the area's farmland. Following that, Israeli forces entered the region to protect the colonizers, preventing local residents from approaching and firing live ammunition at them. Fortunately, no injuries were reported.

Additionally, the colonizers invaded the area around homes in the eastern part of the village, with the support of Israeli forces who entered through the eastern entrance and fired live ammunition at the houses.

**On May 19, 2026**, a group of colonizers vandalized gravestones in the villages of Kisan and Rashayda, located east of Bethlehem. The attackers destroyed gravestones that had been in place since the British Mandate, including those of martyrs. The cemetery, located 3 kilometers east of the village, contains more than 2,000 graves, three water wells, and a prayer area. The colonizers have repeatedly attempted to prevent Palestinians from burying their dead in this cemetery, as they did today when they tried to stop the residents of Rashayda from burying a child. However, the residents resisted and were ultimately able to proceed with the burial.



**On May 21, 2026**, a Palestinian man named Sameh Samara and his son were injured in an attack by colonizers in the village of Yasid, located north of Nablus. The colonizers stormed the village and attacked them, resulting in serious bruises and injuries.

**On May 30, 2026**, Seven citizens were injured by live fire and beatings during an attack by colonizers on the village of Madma, south of Nablus.

According to a statement by Rafidia Hospital regarding that, the following individuals arrived at the emergency room: Mansour Hassan Muhammad Ziada (46 years old) , a resident of Madma: a shrapnel wound to the right side of his face. Linda Amin Fayeze Nassar (49 years old): a head injury from a stone and an assault with a stick on her back. Maysoun Adnan Khaled Ramadan (46 years old): an injury to her right foot, in addition to exposure to tear gas. Mamoun Amin Fayeze Nassar (52 years old): a gunshot wound to the left thigh (entry and exit wounds), and a head wound. Kholoud Amin Fayeze Nassar (54 years old): an assault with a stick on her left hand and shoulder. Amir Amin Fayeze Nassar (40 years old): an injury from tear gas, in addition to a head injury from a stone. Muhammad Amin Fayeze Nassar (56 years old): an assault with a stick, and a gunshot wound to the back of his thigh (entry and exit wounds). The head of the Madma Village Council, Rami Nassar, stated that dozens of colonizers from the new colonial outpost established on lands north of the village attacked shepherds. The sheep were in the area, and live ammunition was fired, while the Red Crescent and the residents were unable to reach them as a result of the intervention of the Israeli occupation army and the closure of the roads leading to the area with earth mounds and iron gates.



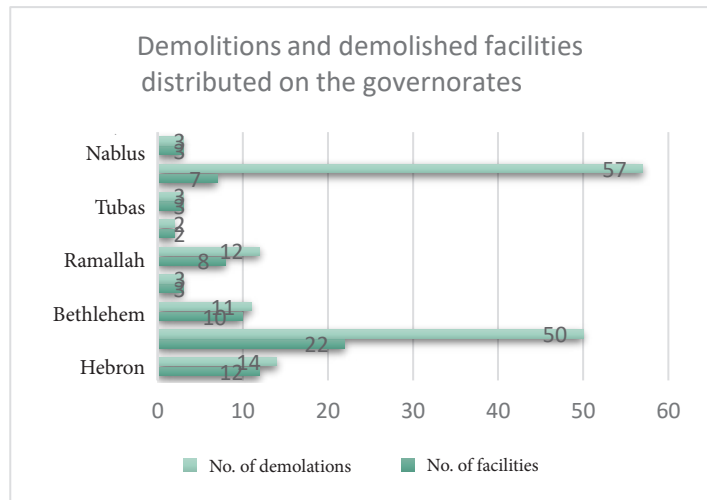
**On May 30, 2026**, a young man was injured after a group of colonizers attacked homes in the town of Qusra, located south of Nablus. Reports indicate that the colonizers targeted residences in the Ras al-Ain area of Qusra. In response to the attacks, local residents resisted, resulting in the young man being stabbed by one of the colonizers.

## Second: Procedures and Practices of the Occupation Authorities against Palestinian Facilities

**Demolitions:** According to the violations database of the Colonization & Wall Resistance Commission, during the reporting period, May 2026, the Israeli occupation authorities carried out 70 demolition operations, affecting 155 facilities across the West Bank, including Jerusalem.

The majority of demolitions were concentrated in Jerusalem Governorate, where 22 demolitions affected 50. This was followed by Hebron Governorate, where 12 demolitions were carried

out and affected 14 facilities. Meanwhile, 10 demolitions were carried out in Bethlehem governorate affected 11 facilities. Next, 8 attacks were recorded in Ramallah & al-Bireh governorate and affected 12 facilities, and 7 demolitions were carried out in Qalqilia and affected 57 facilities.

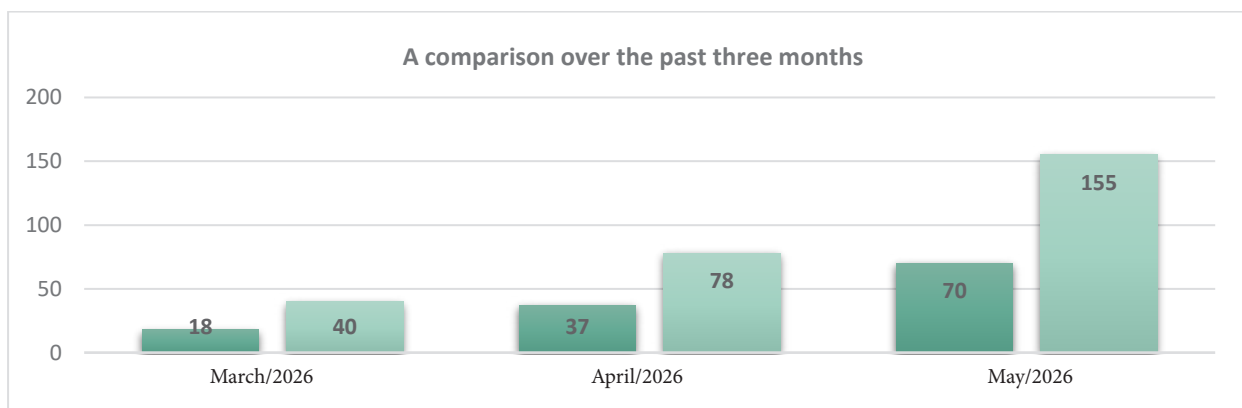


Regarding demolition operations (refer to the demolition notifications section), an inseparable link between issued notifications and actual demolitions becomes evident, particularly in the southern and northern parts of the West Bank. This region contains vast areas targeted by the Israeli occupation for displacement and depopulation in favor of colonial expansion. The demolitions during the reporting period affected various types of facilities, including inhabited facilities, uninhabited and under-construction facilities, agricultural facilities, mobile homes (caravans), commercial and industrial barracks, and water wells as is demonstrated by the following table.

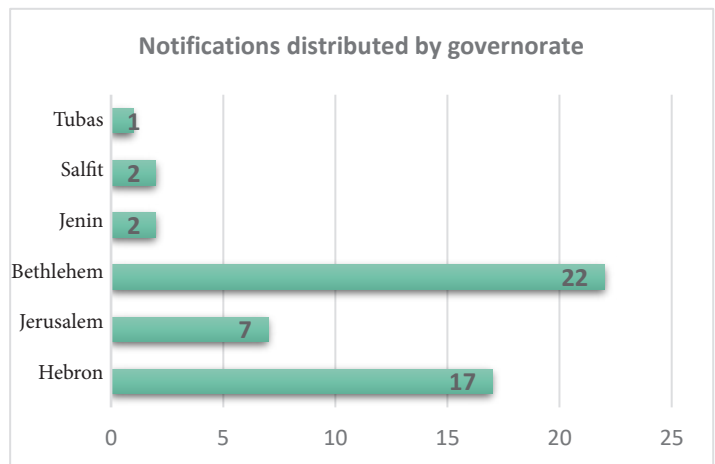


## B. Notifications (Demolition, Construction Moratorium, and Eviction)

During the reporting period, May 2026, Israeli occupation authorities issued 51 notifications, including notifications of demolition, construction moratorium orders under the pretext of lacking permits, and eviction notifications under the pretext of military training.

The majority of these notifications were concentrated in Bethlehem Governorate with 22 notifications, followed by Jerusalem Governorate, which received 7 notifications.

Demolition notifications issued by the Israeli occupation authorities in the occupied West Bank are considered one of the tools used to besiege Palestinians in Area “C” and deprive them of urban development and expansion. The occupation’s control over these areas, which constitute 61% of the West Bank, denies Palestinians their right to prepare master plans. Even if these plans are prepared and submitted, they are rejected. This is in order to utilize Area “C” and retain it as a strategic reserve for any future colonial expansion.



### **Third: Land Expropriation (Land Confiscation)**

In May 2026, the Israeli occupation authorities seized 393.183dunums of privately owned land through 4 land seizure orders for establishing 3 military sites in Jenin governorate for security and military purposes. These orders were issued for the construction of security roads, distributed as follows: 3 in the Bethlehem Governorate, 2 in the Tubas Governorate, and 1 in the Jenin Governorate, for the establishment of a buffer zone around the Sanur colony.

In May 2026, the Israeli occupation authorities seized 393.183dunums of privately owned land through 4 land seizure orders for establishing 3 military sites in Jenin governorate. : One in the Jabriyat neighborhood in Jenin city, another in the village of Zabda, and a third in the town of Qabatiya. The fourth order was intended to create a buffer zone around a colony on land belonging to the city of Yatta in Hebron Governorate.

Additionally, the Israeli authorities issued an order declaring 400 meters of land in Kafr ad-Dik, located in Salfit Governorate, as state land for the benefit of the colonial site called “Leshem”. They also issued two expropriation orders that led to the seizure of a total of 387 dunams of land in the city of al-Bireh and the village of Beitin for the construction of a colonial road connecting the colonial outpost of Givat Asaf, which is built on land belonging to the governorate. Furthermore, land was appropriated in al Nabi Samuel area of the Jerusalem Governorate to control an archaeological site that includes a mosque. Additionally, the so-called Blue Line team added a total of 3 dunams of land in the village of Kafr Qaddum, east of Qalqilya, to areas that had been confiscated since 1989, bringing the total confiscation in this area to 21 dunams.

#### **Fourth: Colonial Expansion Plans (Submitted and Deposited) and Bids**

In May 2026, the planning authorities in the occupying state studied a total of 19 master plans in favor of West Bank colonies within the municipal boundaries of the occupation municipality in occupied Jerusalem. The occupation issued 10 master plans for West Bank colonies and 9 were studied for occupied Jerusalem colonies within municipal boundaries.

The Israeli occupation municipality in occupied Jerusalem deposited 4 master plans and approved 5 others. Meanwhile, the planning authorities affiliated with the “Civil Administration” studied 10 master plans for West Bank colonies, 8 of which it approved and deposited 2 others for the purpose of constructing 657 new colonial units on an area of 6491 dunums.

#### **First: Master Plans in the West Bank:**

The maps attached to the master plans indicate that the occupation authorities have approved of 2 major master plans. The first pertains to the Kfar Tapuach colony, established on the lands of the village of Yasouf in the eastern part of the governorate, where plan number 901 /7 /1 /שׂי was approved, aiming to expand colonial road covering an area of 4693 dunums over a length of 18 km. The second plan targets the Far’a Valley through an expansion plan for the Massua colony, established on lands in Nablus Governorate. The plan, bearing the number 1/6/312/שׂי, aims to construct 517 colonial units on an area of 1,692.2 dunums of privately owned citizens' lands.

### **Fifth: Laws and Bills proposed or approved by the Israeli Knesset in May**

In this part of the report, we review the most prominent of the laws and bills that were studied in the Occupation's Knesset. Considering the nature of these laws, their hostile and racist nature can be inferred, through which the legislative bodies in the occupation state seek to entrench a system of suppression against Palestinians or to perpetuate the racial segregation and apartheid imposed on them.

## **Sixth: Attitudes and Racist Statements by Prominent Characters in the Israeli Occupation State:**

These days, leaders of the Israeli occupation have started making their racist statements unabashedly, revealing their superiority complexes and racist stances. In this section of the report, we quickly review the most prominent statements.

- On May 1, 2026, Orit Strook, so-called “Minister of Settlement”, stated that the Oslo Accords handed Arab cities in the West Bank over to the Palestinians, asserting that the government's duty is to colonize the entire land and consolidate Israeli sovereignty over it.<sup>3</sup>
- On May 15, 2026, Orit Strook, so-called “Minister of Settlement”, stated that the only logical solution is for the Gaza Strip to return to Israeli control, calling for measures to be taken against the Palestinian Authority's presence.<sup>4</sup>
- On May 1, 2026, MK Tzvi Succot stated that the Oslo Accords are the root of all problems in the region, asserting that they must be annulled in both practice and law.<sup>5</sup>
- On May 13, 2026, MK Tzvi Succot called for the restoration of a permanent Jewish presence and the "Od Yosef -Hay" religious school to the area of Joseph's Tomb.<sup>6</sup>
- On May 7, 2026, Bezalel Smotrich, Israeli Minister of Finance, stated that his government is building "the Land of Israel" and working to thwart the idea of establishing a Palestinian state.<sup>7</sup>
- On May 11, 2026, Bezalel Smotrich, Israeli Minister of Finance, stated that his government has prepared a plan to transfer strategic areas from Areas A and B to Area C, affirming the continuation of colony expansion and the consolidation of Israeli control in the West Bank.<sup>8</sup>
- On May 11, 2026, Bezalel Smotrich, Israeli Minister of Finance, affirmed that the West Bank constitutes Israel's security belt, calling for the entrenchment of Israeli control over it and the deepening of colonization within it.<sup>9</sup>
- On May 13, 2026, Bezalel Smotrich, Israeli Minister of Finance, stated that the Jewish presence at Joseph's Tomb must become permanent, describing this as part of cementing Israel's presence in the area.<sup>10</sup>
- On May 7, 2026, Yoav Kisch, Israeli Minister of Education, announced the return of educational institutions to northern Samaria following years of Israeli withdrawal from the area.<sup>11</sup>

- On May 8, 2026, Yaron Rosenthal, Head of the Gush Etzion Regional Council, pledged to continue working toward the demolition of Palestinian structures he described as unlawful in the Bethlehem wilderness area.<sup>12</sup>
- On May 6, 2026, Yaron Rosenthal, Head of the Gush Etzion Regional Council, affirmed the necessity of developing colonies and expanding governmental cooperation in support of them.<sup>13</sup>
- On May 7, 2026, the Nachala Settlement Association expressed its hope to expand colonies to encompass all areas it considers part of the Land of Israel.<sup>14</sup>
- On May 9, 2026, the Nachala Settlement Association described the Evyatar colony as a model that could be replicated for the establishment of Israeli colonies in the Gaza Strip.<sup>15</sup>
- On May 13, 2026, Limor Son Har-Melech called for the annulment of the Oslo Accords and the restoration of full responsibility to Israel.<sup>16</sup>
- On May 12, 2026, Yisrael Gantz, Head of the Binyamin Regional Council, affirmed that colonial farms serve as a tool for consolidating Israeli control and ensuring that lands remain under Israeli control in the future.<sup>17</sup>
- On May 13, 2026, Yossi Dagan, Head of the Samaria Regional Council, described the decision to expand activity at Joseph's Tomb as a step toward restoring Israeli sovereignty over the site.<sup>18</sup>
- On May 14, 2026, Yossi Dagan affirmed that the government is working toward what he described as a historical correction, through the protection of heritage sites and the consolidation of Israeli control over them.<sup>19</sup>
- On May 13, 2026, Rabbi Yitzhak Shapira called for the restoration of permanent settlement in the area of Joseph's Tomb and the reinforcement of the Jewish presence there.<sup>20</sup>
- On May 13, 2026, Rabbi Yosef Elitzur expressed his support for the permanent return of the religious school to the area of Joseph's Tomb.<sup>21</sup>
- On May 11, 2026, the Regavim organization accused the European Union of supporting the establishment of a Palestinian state, affirming its continued efforts to impose Israeli sovereignty over the West Bank.<sup>22</sup>
- On May 14, 2026, Amichai Eliyahu, Minister of Heritage, called for changing the existing reality at archaeological sites he considers part of Jewish heritage.<sup>23</sup>
- On May 14, 2026, Haim Katz, Minister of Tourism, affirmed that investment in tourist sites in the West Bank aims to entrench Israel's attachment to it.<sup>24</sup>

- On May 14, 2026, Miki Zohar, Minister of Culture and Sport, stated that the development of ancient Samaria reinforces Israeli national identity.<sup>25</sup>
- On May 14, 2026, Amichai Shikli announced his support for projects aimed at consolidating Israeli presence at historical sites in the West Bank.<sup>26</sup>
- On May 14, 2026, Yitzhak Kroizer called for the removal of mosques and the construction of the Temple in their place.<sup>27</sup>
- On May 14, 2026, MK Ariel Kallner of the Likud party affirmed that the current government is leading an unprecedented expansion of colonization.<sup>28</sup>
- On May 14, 2026, Eli Cohen, Minister of Energy and Infrastructure, stressed that Jerusalem will remain the eternal capital of Israel.<sup>29</sup>
- On May 17, 2026, Benjamin Netanyahu, Israeli Prime Minister, affirmed the continuation of development works in the area of the Western Wall and its associated archaeological excavations, in order to consolidate Israel's attachment to the city of Jerusalem.<sup>30</sup>
- On May 17, 2026, Rabbi Shmuel Eliyahu called for the establishment of a Jewish synagogue in the area of Al-Aqsa Mosque compound.<sup>31</sup>
- On May 14, 2026, the "BeYadeinu" organization announced the raising of Israeli flags inside Al-Aqsa Mosque on the occasion of the so-called Jerusalem Day.<sup>32</sup>
- On May 11, 2026, the "BeYadeinu" organization called for the continued raising of the Israeli flag inside Al-Aqsa Mosque as a permanent tradition.<sup>33</sup>

- On May 19, 2026, Limor Son Har-Melech called for halting financial transfers to the Palestinian Authority as part of what she described as erasing the Oslo legacy.<sup>37</sup>
- On May 19, 2026, the Nachala Settlement Association declared the slogan "We will liberate Gaza and colonize Gaza" in support of re-establishing colonies in the Strip.<sup>38</sup>
- On May 19, 2026, Yitzhak Kroizer called for the resumption of Israeli colonization in the Gaza Strip following the war.<sup>39</sup>
- On May 19, 2026, Bezalel Smotrich affirmed his support for resuming Israeli colonization in the Gaza Strip.<sup>40</sup>

- On May 18, 2026, Bezalel Smotrich praised efforts aimed at economically undermining the Palestinian Authority and reducing its financial resources.<sup>50</sup>
- On May 20, 2026, Meir Deutsch stated that the establishment of a Palestinian state constitutes a danger, calling for confronting Palestinian construction projects in the West Bank.<sup>51</sup>

- On May 23, 2026, Avi Dichter announced the allocation of vast areas to Israeli farmers, affirming that there is no difference between the West Bank and the rest of Israel.<sup>57</sup>
- On May 23, 2026, Orit Strook affirmed that the areas of the West Bank are part of the Land of Israel, calling for the abolition of the divisions resulting from the Oslo Accords<sup>58</sup>.
- On May 25, 2026, the Efrat Local Council stated that Solomon's Pools must be returned to Israeli control.<sup>59</sup>
- On May 25, 2026, Simcha Rothman affirmed his rejection of the Oslo divisions, stating that the entire land must be under Israeli sovereignty.<sup>60</sup>
- On May 25, 2026, Tzvi Succot called for abolishing the Oslo area boundaries and returning to Areas A and B in order to consolidate Israeli control over them.<sup>61</sup>
- On May 26, 2026, Ohad Tal praised the Nachala Association and its role in supporting colonial expansion.<sup>62</sup>
- On May 27, 2026, May Golan called for colonial expansion across all areas, including the Gaza Strip.<sup>63</sup>
- On May 28, 2026, Amit Halevi stated that Jewish colonization is the clearest expression of the right to the land.<sup>64</sup>

- On May 28, 2026, Osher Shekalim affirmed that colonization aims to create geographical contiguity and prevent Palestinian control over lands.<sup>65</sup>
- On May 28, 2026, Nissim Vaturi called for preserving geographical contiguity between Jerusalem and Hebron.<sup>66</sup>
- On May 28, 2026, Yariv Levin called for supporting the Mirom Yehuda colonial project and strengthening contiguity between Jerusalem and Hebron.<sup>67</sup>
- On May 28, 2026, Yariv Levin congratulated the Nachala Association on the occasion of the first anniversary of the establishment of the Mirom Yehuda colony.<sup>68</sup>
- On May 26, 2026, Limor Son Har-Melech called for dismantling what she described as the legacy of the Oslo Accords.<sup>69</sup>
- On May 27, 2026, Yisrael Gantz stated that the digital land registration project represents a step toward consolidating colonization and Israeli control<sup>70</sup>.
- On May 27, 2026, Shlomo Karhi affirmed that the development of telecommunications infrastructure serves as a tool for consolidating Israeli sovereignty.<sup>71</sup>
- On May 27, 2026, the BeYadeinu organization called for the permanent raising of the Israeli flag in Al-Aqsa Mosque.<sup>72</sup>
- On May 27, 2026, Yitzhak Kroizer affirmed that Israeli sovereignty must be entrenched in Al-Aqsa Mosque.<sup>73</sup>
- On May 28, 2026, Bezalel Smotrich called for encouraging residence in the West Bank and eliminating the idea of a Palestinian state.<sup>74</sup>
